Colonel Kenneth O. Johnson, Jr. National Chief Secretary, The Salvation Army

Kenneth O. Johnson, Jr. was born into the home of Salvation Army parents in Lynchburg, Virginia. As a fourth generation Salvationist, Kenneth developed very quickly the zeal for service to others through the mission of The Salva-tion Army.

Upon graduation from the University of North Carolina - Asheville with a degree in Business Administration, Ken and his wife Paula entered The Salvation Army's College for Officers' Training and were commissioned in 1984 as members of the Servants of God session. The Johnson's ministry path has been multifaceted including field appointments in the Texas Division, serving on the faculty of the College for Officers Training as the Business Administrator and three appointments as the Chief Financial Officer for the National Capital and Virginia Division in Washington, DC, the North and South Carolina Division, and finally the Florida Division. After completing appointments as the Divisional Commander of the Georgia Division and the Texas Division, Ken was appointed to the Territorial Board of Trustees serving as the Secretary for Business Administration for all business activities in the 1

southern states and the District of Columbia. During that time Ken served on The Salvation Army's National Business Administrators Conference and was elected as the Treasurer of the Board of Directors for the Blue Ridge Institute for Southern Community Executives. Ken also served as the Financial Director for the Blue Ridge Development Fund, Inc.

In 2010 Colonel Johnson embarked on international service serving as the Territorial Commander for The Salvation Army's Eastern Europe Territory. Based in Moscow, Russia Colonel Johnson gave direction to the ministry of The Salvation Army in Russia, Ukraine, Moldova, Romania and the Republic of Georgia. During this time the Colonel also served on two Salvation Army High Councils, that body of world leaders tasked with electing the worldwide Generals of The Salvation Army.

Upon his return to the USA Colonel Johnson served as the Divisional Commander for the Florida Division and then transitioned to the USA East Territory where he served as the Territorial Chief Secretary. It was from there that he was appointed to his present assignment as the National Chief Secretary for all Salvation Army activities in the USA. (pg.3)

tveterans are still traumatized; they don't talk to people or leave their homes. Then they get one of the dogs and their lives change. What the dogs can do is beyond belief. In 2006, the founder. Laurie Stevens, was at the VA hospital and saw veterans trying vo train their own dogs. She was a dog trainer and started Patriot Paws with four volunteers and four dogs. After that she was on a program about "Women Who Make a Difference." and the phone started ringing. Sometime today we get four hundred requests ffor service dogs a month. It takes about \$35,000 to raise and train one dog. It is all funded by donations. The dogs start their training at six to eight weeks old with trainers at Patriot Paws. Then they go to DFW puppy raisers for about three months where they are in a home environment. Then they go to one of two women's prisons or a men's prison where they are trained twenty-four hours a days to keep up with their cues. Having them go to the Criminal Justice System saves Patriot Paws a lot of money, but it also reduces the recidivism rate of those inmates to less than one percent. Some go on to get jobs in the dog industry. Then the dogs go to Texas A&M where they go to class, movies and parties. The dogs learn everything they need to know to live in society and to be good dogs. When the veterans come to get a dog, there are about twice as many dogs a the veterans. The veterans do not choose their dogs; the dogs choose them. Then they spend the next week fine tuning the dog and the veteran for what the veteran needs.

Elizabeth Maupin, a trainer at
Patriot Paws, spoke next. She
brought Rudder, a four month old
Black Lab who is in training with Jeanette,
one of the DFW puppy raisers. It takes about
two and a half years before a dog is ready to


