Chris Cassidy, President and CEO National Medal of Honor Museum Foundation

Background

In August 2021, the Board of Directors for the National Medal of Honor Museum Foundation selected Chris Cassidy to be President and CEO, where he now leads the project to build the iconic Museum, Monument, and Institute. Our team is on a mission to inspire America, promoting the belief everyone is born service, he was awarded the Bronze Star with combat 'V' and with the potential to be extraordinary. Chris is the embodiment of this truth. From humble beginnings in the upper Northeast, he chose a life of service to country. First, as an elite Navy SEAL and then as NASA's Chief Astronaut, he has always put others first and given back to the country which gave him boundless opportunities.

Early Life and Education

Christopher J. Cassidy was born in Salem, Massachusetts on January 4, 1970 and considers nearby York, Maine, where he grew up, to be his hometown. A graduate of York High School, Chris completed Naval Academy Prep School in Newport, Rhode Island in 1989 and received a Bachelor of Science in Mathematics from the U.S. Naval Academy in 1993. Cassidy was selected as an astronaut in 2004. He is a veteran of three space flights and ten space walks. Chris has flown to the International Space Station (ISS) aboard the Space Shuttle Endeavor and the Russian Soyuz spacecraft. He has accumulated 377 days in space to include his most recent six-month spaceflight in 2020. In 2015, he became NASA's 14th Chief Astronaut and served in this capacity for two years.

about restaurants. He moved to Texas in 1979 and to Dallas in 1991. Yje book starts when he moved to Dallas and worked for Noman Brinker. Dallas and Houston are the cities where more people eat out than in the other cities in Texas. Their residents eat out six to seven meals a week. The national average is three to four ties a week. The hospitality industry employs about two million people in Texas. The hospitality industry is the second largest employer in the nation; the only largest employer is the government. There are twenty-two restaurants in Preston Center. There are sixty-five million square feet in restauranrs. An average resturant grosses about \$2 million. At the height of the economy, Pei Wei had thity-five restaurants under it's umbrella and served about eight hundred people a day. They make over five million a year in the Metroplex. Each Pei Wei employs forty-five to fifty people. He was at a meeting of twelve people to think about a new restaurant idea. He realized he was the only one there who had a college degree. A lot of successful people in the restaurant business who have worked their way up. They made over \$125,000 a year. We all want to create something other people enjoy. When he goes to a restaurant, he wants to see people smiling and enjoying their day. They also want to create something in the community. Phil Romano came to him with the idea of Trinity Grove. He drove over the old Continental Bridge and did not see any reason to go there. Phil Romano had a vision and wanted to create a restaurant theme park. They opened ten restaurants in twenty months, and people started going to West Dallas. Then other businesses came to West Dallas. It became a living area that is close to downtown. Ultimately, it showed what a restaurant area can do for a community.
