to Dallas, a family friend, Leroy Howard, invited him to join RCPC. Since then he has realized that this club is what a Rotary club should be.

President Happy introduced our speaker today, Leslie Gray, Chief Development Officer, who spoke on "The Warren Center."

The Warren Center was founded by a group of parents in 1968 to work with their children who had developmental disabilities. They focus on children aged birth to three. They also provide family education and support services. They handle early childhood intervention in Northeast Dallas County. They are the largest agency serving young children in Dallas County, and serve about 1200 children a week. They provide service to young children in their homes or daycares, and teach parents how to continue the therapies at home. The children aged three to eight come into the office. When the offices had to close for COVID, they switched to Zoom by the next Monday. They will continue to provide telehealth services. Some of the families did not have computers. A church donated ipads for those families so they could continue receiving therapy for their children. In 2021 they began providing autism assessments. They are partially funded by the state and by Medicaid, but also bill insurance for therapy services. They must raise the funds to provide the rest of their services. Ninetyseven percent of the children they serve are under five; sixty-four percent are male, and fifty-seven percent come from very lowincome families. Ninety percent of their income goes to programming. She was asked if they had seen more need for speech therapy since people have been wearing masks. she said that she didn't know why, but there had been more parents calling for speech services. When the children reach age eight, they usually go into the school districts. They have programs to help the kids and parents get ready to transition to school.

bian and international Rotary members as part of the Partners for a Malaria-Free Zambia program, which in 2021 became the first member-led project to receive The Rotary Foundation's \$2 million Programs of Scale grant. With funds from World Vision U.S. and the Gates Foundation, they will have \$6 million to carry out a three-year program

to recruit, train, and support 2,500 commu-

nity health workers to combat malaria.

They provided community health workers with bicycles, cellphones, laptops, uniforms and other supplies to start their work. Instead of patients having to travel to the nearest health center, their volunteers bring malaria tests and medicines directly to rural communities. They have already found that more cases are being quickly diagnosed and treated. - excerpted from Rotary Voices, Feb. 2, 2022.


