Paul Chafetz, Clinical Psychologist, Author Loving Difficult Older Relatives

Dr. Paul Chafetz is a psychologist, author, educator and speaker from Dallas.

Dr. Chafetz earned his Bachelor's degree in psychology at Brown Univer- transitions, including: sity, and his PhD in Clinical and Health Psychology at the University of Florida. He completed his Clinical Psychology internship at Duke University Medical Center, and a two-year post-doctoral fellowship at T.R.I.M.S. (Texas Research Institute of Mental Sciences) in the Houston Medical Center.

Dr. Chafetz opened his private practice of clinical psycholo-gy when he arrived in Dallas in 1982. It was part-time until 2003 and has been full time since then. Along the way, he also taught psychology at Texas Woman's University for two years and at The University of Texas Southwestern Medical Center in Dallas as an asso-ciate professor for nineteen years.

Rotary Establishes Peace Center at Makerere University

Inaugural 2021 class will focus on shaping peace and development in Africa from Rotary Weekly, January 17, 2020

KAMPALA, Uganda (9 January 2020) Rotary and Makerere University are offering a postgraduate certificate program to peace and development leaders who are from or who have worked in Africa to address the underlying challenges to peace in the region

The year-long program in Peacebuilding, Conflict Transformation and Development will emphasize issues and solutions that are of particular relevance throughout the African continent and beyond. Hands-on experience and coursework will address topics including human rights, govern-

ance, and the role of the media in conflict. Other studies will focus on refugees and migration, as well as resource and identity-based conflicts.

The program will incorporate the Positive Peace framework pioneered by the Institute for Economics and Peace and will apply concepts grounded in mediation and negotiation, African philosophy, and indigenous mechanisms for conflict resolution. "For centuries, we have looked at peace as the absence of violence, without fully considering the other drivers in play," said Olayinka Babalola, VP, RI Board of Directors. "Instead of merely examining the causes of war, Rotary Peace Fellows at Makerere University

President Richard Stanford is back and called the meeting to order. Kita Hobbs gave the invocation. PP Rick Amsberry led the Pledge of Allegiance and "The Star Spangled Banner." Our visitors and guests were introduced. VP Happy Franklin introduced our Marketplace Advertiser of the Week. She then reminded us of PCR Connect breakfast on February 13 at Flying Fish. Sarah Oliai reported that the winning vote for the theme of the Fourth of July parade was "Stars, Stripes and Service."

Stan Wright highlighted the six Humanitarian Outreach Committees saying the members are Unsung Heroes. Jim Weichel is the Chair of the Meals on Wheels Committee; the volunteers on this committee deliver meals on two routes four days every week. Michael Rainwater chairs Dentistry with a Heart, which held their ninth annual clinic in October when they treated thirty-eight patients. PP Doug Means is chair of the Fisher House Committee which serves dinner once or twice a month to the families of veterans being seen at the VA Hospital. Jina McDaniel is chair of the Ronald McDonald House Committee, which serves dinner once a month to families who have children being treated at Children's Medical Center or Scottish Rite Hospital. Stan Wright is the chair of the Mobile Food Pantry Committee, which is manned by RCPC members once a month. President Richard awarded Rob Levy his Blue Badge.

PPs Ley Waggoner and Pam Carvey began the program by saying that the RCPC

Foundation had been working on this project for about a year. The club has had large projects in the past: the Courtyard at Hillcrest H.S., the Centennial Project of an accessible playground at Bachman Lake, and in 2015 the Mobile Food Pantry for the North Texas Food Bank. In 2018 the RCPC Foundation gave grants of \$5,000 to Bonton Farms and of \$7,200 to Agape Clinic.

They then introduced Matthew Trogdon and Steven White from Bonton Farms. Matthew began by explaining that it is called Bonton Farms because they grow and cultivate people who, like plants, need the right environment to become what they could be. They need safe and affordable housing, education, jobs and job skills to flourish. So far they have created about thirty-five jobs, but the families also need to learn financial literacy and how to budget. Bonton is a food desert; there is no grocery store within three miles. They are now cultivating forty-two acres, so the residents have access to fresh food. Stephen explained that Bonton is six miles from Downtown Dallas near a levy of the Trinity River. There is inequity in healthcare in South Dallas. Bonton has grown tremendously; it's budget is ten times what it was, but they still have little access to healthcare, which is vital to a community.

Stephanie Bohan, the Executive Director of Agape Clinic spoke next. She explained that Agape Clinic provides healthcare to the indigent and to the working poor or to those with insurance whose deductibles are so high that they cannot use it. Last year they saw approximately 18,000 patients and provided about \$9 million in healthcare, with a budget of about \$1 million. She said that at Agape Clinic if someone asks you for help, you help them. RCPC were some of the first people to give them a grant. Then Dentistry with a Heart has provided services there, and the Mobile Food Pantry disperses food to families there. When she heard a previous program on Bonton Farms, she offered (cont. on pg. 3)



Bonton will build the building. RCPC will raise \$150,000 to provide the furniture, fixtures and equipment for the clinic and to fund the first year of operation. Initially it will be staffed with volunteers, but then they will add paid staff. Ongoing upkeep is not included, just the medical needs. Already, \$70,000 has been raised: the Communities Foundation of Texas has pledged \$50,000 over three years, \$10,000 dollars has been contributed by the Roach Howard Smith & Barton Foundation which is chaired by PP Karen Farris, \$5,000 has been contributed by President Richard and \$5,000 has been contributed by District 5810. The club's history of major projects is stellar; there are extraordinary benefactors in the club and members with extraordinary connections. If any members have connections to a Foundation, RCPC has a powerpoint presentation to use or a member will make the presentation.
