What you should know about quantum science and Rotary (exerpted from Rotary Voices)
by Manouchehr Shamsrizi, Rotary eClub of Silicon Valley

As a longtime member of Rotaract in Germany and now as a member of the Rotary eClub of Silicon Valley, I have witnessed the profound impact of scientific and technological advancements and their translation into (social) entrepreneurship for humanity, notably Rotary's areas of focus. I have seen these things in my professional role as a startup founder and currently as co-director of "leap.berlin" Germany's capital hub for quantum technology initiated by the "Berlin University Alliance."

On 7 June 2024 the UN declared 2025 as "The International Year of Quantum Science and Technology," aiming "to use the occasion of 100 years of quantum mechanics in 2025 to help raise public awareness of the importance and impact of quantum science and applications on all aspects of life."

A recent publication by the World Economic Forum is particularly suitable for making these considerations comprehensible: "Embracing the Quantum Economy: A Pathway for Business Leaders" explores the impact of quantum technologies on various industries and outlines strategic steps for businesses to get started with these technologies.

It was President **Nolan's** birthday! He was presented with a piece of birthday cake and a group rendition of "Happy Birthday."

President **Nolan** asked for a volunteer to pick up member, **Sam Miller** each Friday and bring him to Rotary. He is not able to drive any more.

Mark Neace encouraged everyone to attend the District's networking event, "Rotary Means Business" on Tuesday, February 11. Bring your friends to show them something about Rotary.

President **Nolan** called for the raffle drawing. The total is now up to \$1200. PP **Ley Waggoner** had the winning ticket, but did not win the lottery.

PP **Eric Heitkamp** introduced our speakers today. He introduced Eric Nadel first who then introduced Ross Fenstermaker.

Eric Nadel started by saying he had called 6,000 games in his twenty-three years of broadcasting. He has had ten partners during that time. The Rangers have a new TV option. It is a combination way to watch games. There is an app where you can watch the games: it costs \$100 for the whole season, which is

about 150 games. The games will also be on Direct TV and will be streaming. The games will be on Charter, and they are in negotiations with the other providers. The games will be simulcast on radio and TV. They have a new sideline reporter who should be good.

He then introduced Ross Fenstermaker, the Rangers' General Manager. He has been the Assistant for ten years. Eric asked him about his priorities during this off-season. Ross said that he has had a lot to do. He wants to reinforce the offense and build up the bullpen. He has been working a lot under the radar to upgrade the club. He is excited about the upcoming season. He feels like the team is going into the season with a hunger to win. He started at the beginning of the off-season in October to narrow in on players they were interested in. He said he made about fifty or sixty calls that ended in nothing. He was asked about free agents. He said they had identified several at the beginning. They met with some of them several times. They want to get the "right" players, not just the most talented. They are constantly in conversation with potential players, looking for players with personalities that will fit in. There are fifteen or sixteen players under consideration and will look at what skill sets are needed. The selection process has changed. There is a large amount of information that comes in; it can be overwhelming. You need people who can distill it down to find the right players. Eric was asked about his career in broadcasting. He said he was announcing hockey in 1979 when he was hired. He was allowed to learn on the job. He said he was lucky with his broadcast partners and learned from them. Ross was asked about players from South America. He said that players from South America can sign at sixteen years old. There are about sixty players in the Dominican Republic. Once they are ready, they are moved up to Arizona. He was asked his favorite players to watch. He said they were the ones with smiles on their faces who were enjoying playing the game.
