

the National Medal of Honor Museum. He began by saying when he was growing up in a small town in Maine, he never thought he would have the



Naval Academy that said it was free to go there and that you had to get a recommendation from your Congressman. He did that, but didn't know he also needed to apply. So when he realized he was not in the system, he went to Annapolis and was directed to the office of an officer where he told his story. A week later he was admitted to the Naval Academy Prep School. He said that without that gift from somebody who didn't know him and whom he never saw again, he would not have been in the Academy, would not have been a Navy SEAL or an astronaut, and would not have the job he has now. All of that was because he was given an opportunity. He explained that SEAL training is about camaraderie and love. When you go through challenging, hard things together, it forms a strong bond. Specifically, SEAL training is six months long; the first two months is about physical fitness, the second two months is SCUBA training, and the last two months is training for land operations. He was deployed to Afghanistan twice, He applied to NASA and spent a week there right before his second deployment. About six months later he got a call from the chief astronaut saying he had been admitted. He spent the next seventeen years with NASA. He was asked to be CEO of the National Medal of Honor Museum. He fell in love with the project as a mission He realized that what he liked about wearing a military uniform was the sense of service it gave him. He feels like the museum is delivering a

product for the nation. There have been 3519

awards of the medal. Sixty-three are alive to-

day. There will also be a leadership institute.
