Mark A. Wynne, Vice President, Associate Director of Research and Director of the Federal Reserve Bank of Dallas's Globalization Institute The Federal Reserve Bank

Wynne is a vice president, associate director of Research and director of the Federal Reserve Bank of Dallas' Globalization Institute.

Since joining the Dallas Fed in 1989, he has had a variety of responsibilities, including advising the Bank's president on national and international economic conditions prior to meetings of the Federal Open Market Committee, briefing the Bank's board of directors and leading the Bank's international economics group. He has conducted research on the effects of fiscal policy, the drivers of business cycles, inflation measurement, the regional impact of global shocks, the natural rate of interest and the workings of monetary unions, among other topics. His research has appeared in many of the leading peer-reviewed academic journals and Federal Reserve publications. He co-

edited the volume The Federal Reserve's Role in the Global Economy: A Historical Perspective with Michael D. Bordo, which was published by Cambridge University Press in 2016.

Wynne has taught at University College Dublin, the University of Rochester, Southern Methodist University and the University of Texas at Dallas.

He is a member of the American Economic Association, the European Economic Association, the Econometric Society, the Council on Foreign Relations and the Dallas Committee on Foreign Relations.

He earned first-class-honors BA and MA degrees from the National University of Ireland–University College, Dublin, and holds MA and PhD degrees in economics from the University of Rochester.

community needs. In the U.S. \$985 billion is given every year in philanthropy. The money flowed to 1.4 million small and large non-profits. Accordingto the annual report from Giving USA, in dollars giving has continued to grow, but the number of people is declining. Sixtyseven per-cent of giving comes from individuals. The num-ber is growing because of individual billionaires. Corporations account for only four percent of philanthropy. Most philanthropy goes to religious organizations. It is shrinking as people feel less connected to education or the arts. CFT does not tell you where to give, but will adsecond in the percentage of household income donated to charity. CFT is a public charity but is like a bank. The person who is donating gets the tax advantage, but CFT handles all of the record keeping and tax forms, etc. They will advise on charities and have donor-advised funds. CFT has about 1200 funds; they are the stewards of the money. CFT is almost seventy years old. It started out as the Community Chest trust fund. It has evolved inft a more community focused model. There are similar funds all across the country. They are all independent, The oldest was formed in Cleveland. Their vision is to help to create a thriving community for all. All includes everyone. Their north star is finding equity, and expanding their community impact through nonprofits. They have an equity-driven board, for and of the community. Over the years they have donated \$25 billion to non-profits, more than sixty percent invested in north Texas. CFT is donor driven; grant money goes up in times of difficulty, such as inflation COVID, etc. They have a team of people out in the community; they visit non-profits and understand what they are trying to accomplish. Non-profits have opportunities to apply for grants. Donor advised funds are donated with the advice of the family who has given the funds, or it could be a club. like RCPC. There are several types of funds that can be set up, including scholarship funds or funds focused on areas like health, youth, etc.
