

Igniting Change for Future Leaders! How C5 Texas Is Helping Youth To Build Their Own Leadership Path



Daneshe Bethune is the Executive Director of C5 Texas, a prominent youth leadership development program for students in grades 8 through 12. With two decades of experience in the non-profit sector, she has excelled in

various leadership roles, including Chief Development Officer, Regional Executive Director, Director of Foundation and Grants, and Grants Manager at esteemed organizations such as The Salvation Army, Big Brothers Big Sisters Lone Star, and the Methodist Health System Foundation.

A results-oriented and approachable leader, Mrs. Bethune is dedicated to empowering young individuals and enhancing their global impact. Her areas of expertise include fund development, executive leadership, strategic management, grants management and writing, organizational dev-elopment, board development, and change management.

Mrs. Bethune earned an MBA in Marketing from Dallas Baptist University and a bachelor's degree in journalism with a concentration in Public Relations from the University of North Texas. She has also completed a nonprofit management certificate program through The Allstate Foundation and the Center for Nonprofit Management. An active member of several esteemed organizations, she participates in the Junior League of Dallas, Jack and Jill of America Southwest Suburban Chapter, and Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority, Incorporated (Xi Theta Omega Chapter). She is a Black Women in Nonprofit Leadership Fellow, holds a Foundational Leadership Certification from the Stagen Leadership Academy, is a Leadership ISD-Dallas Fellow, and is a mem-ber of the Public Relations Society of Ameri-ca. Additionally, she co-authored "I Said What I Said: An Anthology of Black Women in Nonprofit."

Daneshe resides with her husband, Walter, and their two children, Makenzie and Michael, along with their beloved pets, Rocket and Bolo. In her spare time, she enjoys practicing yoga, attending live music events, and watching romantic comedies.

A three-time Super Bowl champion and five-time Pro Bowl selection, Darren Woodson is often recognized as one of the greatest players to wear a Dallas Cowboys uniform. A native of Phoenix, Woodson played football at Mary-

School as a running back and linebacker. He attended Arizona State University, where he was a converted linebacker for the Sun Devils and earned his Bachelor of Science in Justice Studies.

In the 1992 NFL Draft, the Dallas Cowboys selected Woodson in the second-round (37th overall). Throughout his 12 seasons (1992-2004) with the Cowboys, he earned a reputation as one of the hardest hitters and most ferocious safeties in the NFL.

Woodson retired in 2004 as the Cowboys' All-Time Leading Tackler with 1,350 career stops and registering career totals of 11 sacks and 23 interceptions. Throughout his NFL career, his dependability, athleticism and aggressiveness helped lead the Cowboys to three Super Bowl Championships (Super Bowl XXVII, XXVIII and XXX) - securing him an elite position in the club's history. In 2015, Woodson was inducted into the prestigious Cowboys "Ring of Honor." He was also named to the Arizona Sports Hall of Fame (2009) and the Texas Sports Hall of Fame (2017). Upon retiring from the NFL, Woodson joined ESPN as an NFL analyst in 2005. He appeared on "NFL Live" and "SportsCenter" and also participated on the network's coverage of the Super Bowl, NFL Draft and NFL training camp specials. After 14 years with the network and commuting weekly to Bristol, Connecticut, Woodson announced his retirement in 2019.

Transitioning from the NFL to a post-playing career is not easy for most athletes —but Woodson has found consistent success. Woodson joined ESRP Advisory Dallas, LLC, "esrp", in 2017 and bridged his storied football career and entrepreneurial spirit with commercial real estate. In May of 2022, esrp merged with Cresa, the world's only global commercial real estate advisory firm that exclusively represents occupiers and specializes in the delivery of fully integrated real estate solutions operating from over 380 offices in 15 territories.

Woodson offices at the Dallas Cowboy World Headquarters - The Star, Cresa's primary office in the Dallas-Fort Worth region as a Managing Principal and is directly involved with the firm's overall vision, growth, and strategy. Woodson focuses on locating, developing, and defining business relationships across a variety of industries and markets. He brings his innate leadership skills and passion for creati winning strategies to meet clients' real estate needs, while delivering a high-level of service. 


President Nolan Duck called the meeting to order. Jeff Brady gave the invocation and then led the Pledge of Allegiance and "The Star Spangled"

brain: it is about making someone feel comfortable with you. Manners make people feel comfortable. She asked on which shoulder do you wear your name badge. The correct answer is your right shoulder



because when you shake hands, you turn that side toward the other person. She asked who goes first in a revolving door. The answer is that the man goes first to push the door. She asked which fork could be on the right of the plate. The answer is an oyster fork if it is going to used with the meal. She asked if you sit in a middle seat on the row whether you should slide along the row facing toward or away from the other people already in the trow. The answer is usually you should face them. 
