The Honorable **Kay Bailey Hutchinson** NATO

For over three years, Kay Bailey Hutchison served as the United States Ambassador to the National Atlantic Treaty Organization (NATO), in Brussels, Belgium. During her term, she focused on the importance of U.S. leadership in the Alliance and strengthening the transatlantic bond that provides the security umbrella for Europe and North America.

From 1993 to 2013, Kay represented the State of Texas, in the United States Senate. She was elected, by her peers, to chair the Republican Policy Committee, making her the fourthranking member of the Republican Leadership in the U.S. Senate She was the ranking member of the Senate Committee on Commerce, Science, and Transportation and Chair of the Military Construction Subcommittee on Appropriations.

Kay served two terms as Chair of the Board of Visitors at The U.S. Military Academy at West Point. While in the Senate, she co-authored significant legislation, including Reauthorization and Reform of NASA, with Senator Bill Nelson (D-FL), and the Hutch-

ison-Mikulski legislation, establishing a new retirement vehicle called the Kay Bailey Hutchison Spousal IRA.

From 1991 to 1993, Kay was the Texas State Treasurer, where she proposed limits on State debt, which the State Legislature adopted. She also led the effort to successfully defeat a State Income Tax.

She is the author of three books, including the bestseller, American Heroines, (William Morrow, 2004). In 2013, the Dallas City Council named the City's Convention Center in her honor. Her alma mater named its Energy Center, The Kay Bailey Hutchison Energy Center at The University of Texas at Austin, and is a collaboration between the McCombs School of Business, the UT School of Law, and the Cockrell School of Engineering.

In Japan Earthquake Relief

from Rotary Voices

It was 4:10 p.m. on January 1 that the earthquake with a magnitude of 7.6 struck the Noto Peninsula in Ishikawa, Japan.

Much infrastructure including water system, roads, airports, ports, government offices, hospitals, and homes were destroyed across a wide area of the Noto Peninsula, leaving many residents in need of medical treatment. In addition to regular patients, Keiju Medical Center also accepted many other patients affected by the disaster and patients from clinics that were no longer able to provide medical care. The workload of the staff has increased to two to three times their normal capacity. Although they were facing with such difficulties, and with *(cont. on pg 3).*

President **Jeff Sheehan** called the meeting to order. **Janie Loveless**

PP Greg Pape remarked that Rotary International has a global reach, providing clean water and sanitation, supporting education, preventing and treating disease, saving mothers and children, protecting the environment, promoting peace and growing local economies. An estimated six million kids under the age of five die each year due to malnutrition, inadequate healthcare and poor sanitation. For forty years RI has been the driving force in the effort to end polio worldwide. To date RI members have contributed \$2.6 billion since 1985. Eighteen million people are walking today who otherwise would have been paralyzed by polio. He thanked Van Oliver for his contribution. He then announced that Trish Cunningham was a sec-

gion hard in 2020. Many clubs and districts focused their attention assisting COVID patients. This was right, but somehospitals needed.

Money and physical goods are not always the answer. The real question is: are we addressing a genuine need?

We discovered a hidden vulnerability: chronically ill patients, especially those with implanted cardiac devices. Access to crucial monitoring was compromised due to lockdown restrictions and COVID prioritization. This was the need we had to address. Realtime telemedicine monitor-`ing was the key to keeping vulnerable patients safe. A local public health agencv built the necessary IT infrastructure. unifying data communication across five different heart implant brands. More at rotaryserviceblog.org.

'Japan' continued doctors and staff also affected by the disaster and unable to get access to enough food, the hospital continues to operate. As doctors noted, "we can't stop times, we provided more goods than what providing medical care." We formed the District 2820 Noto Peninsula Earthquake Emergency Support Team.

First, we asked district members to donate. We collected food and supplies. Late at night January 11, we loaded three fourton trucks and a van with relief supplies and headed to Noto Peninsula. We arrived at the hospital at 8 a.m. the next day and started moving supplies in. Hospital staff said "District 2820 truly demonstrated the magic of Rotary." More at rotaryvoicesblog.org
