Sheriff Marion Brown

Update from the Dallas County Sheriff

Sheriff Brown grew up in Dallas. She was educated in Dallas Public Schools. She is a graduate of University of Texas Arlington, where she obtained her Bachelor of Arts Degree in Communications.

Sheriff Brown began her law enforcement career in 1988 with the Duncanville, TX. Police Department as a pioneer, being the first African American female police officer. Sheriff Brown rose quickly within the ranks from a patrol officer.

Her experience includes serving as a first line supervisor; formulating and supervising the Community Oriented Policing Unit; Crime prevention/Community Relations Supervisor; Patrol Watch Commander; Criminal Investigations Commander; and Assistant Chief of Police.

Sheriff Brown holds a Master Peace Officer Certification from the Texas Commission on Law Enforcement. She is a graduate of the International Law Enforcement Institute's Command College as well as the FBI National Academy Associates' Command College. She has received training in Special Investigative Topics, Crime Prevention, Hostage Negotiation, and holds an Instructor Certification.

As a chief deputy with the Dallas County Sheriff's Office, her area of responsibility included directing three assistant chiefs who manage Human Resource Development/Training and Personnel; Judicial Services (Bailiffs); Warrant and Civil Execution; Criminal Investigations; Highway Management/Traffic/Patrol; Courtesy Patrol and Communications.

Sheriff Brown takes pride in using her experience to educate the community and promote partnerships that foster genuine, positive relationships between police and the community.

· First elected Dallas County Sheriff in 2018 after being appointed Interim Sheriff by the Dallas County Commissioner's Court

· Prior to becoming Sheriff, worked as a Dallas County Sheriff Chief Deputy

President Happy introduced our speaker today. Jeff Bednar. co-founder of Profound Farms. He said that he had in common with Rotary that it was about community. In 2014 he bought his 2.6 acre farm in Lucas. Prior to that he was in real estate. He thought that the way crops were grown in the U.S. and the rest of the world was very destructive because

the farmers were not puting nutrients back in the soil. He wanted to make a difference with food. He had had no farming experience, so he took


three years off to learn from others. He became a master gardener. He didn't sell anything for the first three years, but wanted to create a system he could replicate. Hydroponics is a big bes of water with plants on top. Aquaponics combines it with growing fish. It is completely organic. He grew tilapia, but it is difficult to maintain the two ecosystems for plants and fish. Now he is using mostly hydroponics because it is more reliable. With the roots in the water it is easy to harvest. He has created symposiums to build community with the farmers and the community. Three years into his growing, he got a call from a chef who wanted to visit. He agreed. The chef wanted to buy herbs, chives and nasturtiums. So he began growing them. In 2017 he was selling to two retaurants. In seven months he was in five restaurants, and he had to build greenhouses to keep up with demand. He remarked that it was interesting to see how chefs transform food to what is on the plate. He now grows 137 different plants, including edible flowers and herbs for cocktails. He grows almost everything from seed; it takes five weeks from seed to harvest, which is less than plants that grow in the soil. He uses ninetyfive percent less water than traditional farms. They use city water, but treat it with vitamin C to convert the chlorine to ammonia. He started a farm to table business. The chefs were serving food straight from the farm to the table. He grows ten different kinds of mint and eleven different basils, often used in cocktails, In 2018 he learned about grants, aapplied and received a grant for \$500,000 over three years to expand his farm. Before the pandemic he sold to 137 different restaurants, but it dropped to four during the pandemic. Lately. he has created Profound Hub to help farmers.
