On 4 February, I had the honor of participating in a panel discussion, "Healing the Wounds of War – Visible and Invisible" at the Ukrainian Cultural Center in Chicago. This event provided a much-needed evening of peace building and discussion on the steps necessary for Ukraine to recover from the devastation of war.

This issue is deeply personal to me. My parents, Lu and Natalie Hewko, fled Ukraine during World War II, escaping Soviet forces and enduring a perilous journey through Europe before finding refuge in the United States. Their courage inspired my commitment to public service and giving back to the country that welcomed them.

My father, a devoted Rotarian, served as president of the Rotary Club of Clarks-

ton, Michigan, and helped establish the Rotary Club in Kyiv, where I am proud to be a charter member. I also had the privilege of working in Ukraine from 1991 to early 1996 Read more on Rotary 360, Feb. 5, 2025.

PP **Richard Stanford** introduced our speaker today, Ann Germann, the Director of Corporate and Foundations Relations at The Senior

Source. She began by saying that the mission of The Senior Source is to enhance the quality of life for older adults in greater Dallas. The U.S. population is growing older. Twelve thousand Americans turn 65 every day. Half the U.S. population is over 50. The population of people over 65 is expected to increase 57%. Dallas also has a growing senior population. The senior population is approximately 15% of the total population. The number of senior residents are currently growing five times faster than other age groups. The senior population is the only demographic where poverty is increasing. Between 2014 and 2019 the number of Dallas seniors living below the poverty level grew by 11%, but in other age groups poverty fell by 17%. In fiscal year 2023-24 The Senior Source served over 23,000 people. They have a variety of programs, including those for financially insecure older adults, caregivers of older adults, and socially isolated older adults. They have technology classes, also. They also have a guardian program for seniors who have no family. They have a caregiver support programs. They have served over 2,100 caregivers, and 82% have said they are experiencing less caregiver related stress. They can get seniors involved in volunteer opportunities such as Senior Companions or Foster Grandparents. Their Senior Companions program engages adults over 55 to support other adults who need extra assistance to remain in their homes as long as possible. The Foster Grandparents are role models, mentors and friends to children with special needs. They have a Long-Term Care Ombudsmen Program who protect the health, safety, welfare and rights of residents in nursing homes and assisted living facilities. They also provide information to the public and educate consumers and facilities.
