Texas Rangers. She said that Chris Young joined the Rangers as Executive Vice Presidetn and General Manager in December of 2020. He took over the operations of the entire baseball operations in August, 2022. Just over a year later, the Metroplex was celebrating the first World Series Championship in sixty-three years. He joined Lesley on stage, and remark-ed that he was happy to see people so excited and proud of the Rangers.



LM: One of the biggest decisions was hiring Bruce Bochy out of retirement.

CY: He said it was a hard decision to make, but that he realized they needed a change of leadership in the dugout. He had the opportunity to play with Bruce in San Diego and he created a great environment. When they looked at the criteria they wanted in their next Manager, it was clear that Bruce met all the criteria. After talking with him, he felt that they had an alignment of vision, culture and how the organization should work together. He is a great lesder.

LM: It was a long season. It was an incredible team, but there was injury after injury.

CY: We felt like at the beginning of the season we had a lot of talent. The expectation was that we were no longer going to lose. We got off to a tremendous start, but late in August we got hit with injuries. We lost five of six all-stars. We try to assemble a roster of 40+ players because of injured and unsung heroes.

LM: They started off as the best offense in major league baseball Then they lost fourteen of sixteen games in a row. Something changed before the last seven games. It seemed like the team had to go through adversity to come together and build the confidence to win the Championship.

LM: She said she will never count a team out again. A standout was beating the Astros. CY: He agreed that beating the in-state nemesis was a turning point. The team had such resilience. Three days after the win, back to work. LM: What is happening in the off deason? CY: We have the core team in place. The pitching staff is the same. We will be filling in holes.
