Troy Vaughn, President-Principle Services What's New in Electric Power and Storage Opportunities in Texas

Troy Vaughn is the owner and President of Principle Services LLC, an infrastructure consulting company. A Texas native, Troy graduated from the United States Military Academy at West Point with a Systems Engineering degree. He went on to spend 6 years in the US Army as an infantry officer, including one deployment to Irag, earning Ranger, Airborne, and Air Assault status, as well as receiving the Bronze Star.

Following his time in the Army, he graduated SMU's Cox School of Business with an MBA in Finance & Opera-- tions. His civilian career started at Sharyland Utilities where he spent eight years, participating in and overseeing all aspects of transmission line and substation construction projects. This background in power delivery infrastructure gave him the platform to launch Principle Services in 2019.

New Programs of Scale Grants for New Year from Rotary Voices

In 2013, Rotary set out on its new grant model under the Future Vision Plan, in the hopes that the approach would enhance the scope, impact, and sustainability of humanitarian projects. More than six years later, and with over \$460 million invested in almost 7,000 projects across the globe, Rotary is ready to augment these critical investments with a new grant type.

Beginning January 2020, Rotary International is introducing a highly selective, competitive grant model that empowers Rotarians to implement large-scale, high impact projects with experienced partners.

In support of Rotary's Action Plan, Rotary

International's Programs of Scale grants will award \$2 million to one approved project each year that responds to a community-identified need. These projects will benefit a large (cont. on pg. 3)



Building Positive Peace in

Venezuela from President of the RC of San Cristobal Metropolitano, in Rotary Voices

I recently discovered a valuable resource on Rotary's website that has strengthened my club's efforts to serve our community and build peace. The Rotary Positive Peace Academy is a free online course, a result of Rotary's partnership with the Institute for Economics & Peace.

Positive Peace is a framework based on empirical facts called "pillars of Positive Peace." It helps identify and understand with real statistics the forces that contribute to peaceful, prosperous and resilient societies.
