Tom Meurer is a retired senior officer and board director of Hunt Consolidated Inc. HCI is a large international private company controlled by Ray L Hunt that includes oil and gas exploration and production, refining, LNG, Real Estate Development, Electrical Power, Private Equity investments and over 500,000 acres of cattle ranches in Arizona, Utah, Wyoming Montana and Texas. Meurer spent 40 years with Hunt, retiring in 2015.

Additionally Meurer spent 7.5 years working for EDS and specifically Ross Perot and further as a corporate board member or trustee for the Perot family interests from 1989 to 2022. He also, since 1985, worked as a trustee for the Hunt Family trusts.

Also he was a trustee for the Perot Museum and a former board member of the Institute for Mideast Studies in Washington DC.

Today, in addition to his fiduciary work for both families, Tom is a board member for the Insitute for Earth and Man at SMU and some other non business boards. He spends his time with his wife Sharon, traveling, writing, reading, wildlife management farming on their farm east of Dallas, fishing in their place in Maznanita, Oregon and fishing in their place on south Padre Island. His hobbies are fishing, farm chores with proper equipment, and exercise.

four-year development plan. The graduates can immediately move into full time jobs from plumbing to electrician, to air conditioning/ heating, etc. It made me smile as I remembered Home Ec classes. This school's kitchen setup is a full-sized restaurant kitchen where they become chefs and can serve student and faculty events. If you want to be an airplane pilot, they have flight simulators that alert the FAA when in use and graduates are ready for flying lessons in actual planes. There were classes on the business of each profession including entrepreneurship for those designing their own company. They have already had successful student businesses as a result. You left the tour so impressed that Dallas is preparing high school students to transition to successful careers after graduation. It was inspiring. Local companies are discovering the quality of the students and are vying for the graduates. It is all early days, but the program is already being visited by high school systems from Houston to Boston to learn how they can replicate the program. Because of the advanced hands-on training, it has become a business community effort to outfit all the tracks with the latest equipment. There are many companies and foundation grants supporting the school's efforts.


