Decrypting the World of Crypto: Demystifying Bitcoin, Ethereum, and Blockchain

Harrison comes to us from Charlotte, NC with Decentralized Project Analysis skills to demystify Bitcoin, Ethereum, and Blockchain. Harrison works for Electrolux, a Swedish multinational home appliance manufacturer headquartered in Stockholm as a Credit Analyst where he analyzes and manages risk for credit lines ranging from thousands to hundreds of millions of dollars. Prior to joining Electrolux, Harrison worked with Red Ventures, a customer acquisition and technology company headquartered in SC, as a Subject Matter Expert in Regulation and Data Analysis and a Compliance Specialist; and prior to joining Red Ventures he served as the Coordinator for startup Studio South in Charlotte, where he assisted the department heads by conducting research and analysis on legislation across the US, negotiating with different government bodies, and overseeing compliance among studio partners and board members. His skills also include Data Analysis, Financial Analysis, Legislative Analysis, and Manual Testing.

A **cryptocurrency** (or **crypto currency**) is a digital asset designed to work as a medium of exchange that uses strong cryptography to secure financial transactions, control the creation of additional units, and verify the transfer of assets.

Cryptocurrencies use decentralized control as opposed to centralized digital currency and central banking systems. The decentralized control of each cryptocurrency works through distributed ledger technology, typically a blockchain, that serves as a public financial transaction database.

Since the release of bitcoin, over 4,000 *alt-coins* (alternative variants of bitcoin, or other cryptocurrencies) have been created. -Wikipedia

President **Paul Pirok** called the meeting to order with **Kita Hobbs** giving the invocation and **Ley Waggoner** as our song leader. We had three new members received their red badges. Announcements were made concerning the volunteers needed for the parade and signing up and paying for the Installation and Awards luncheon, June 28 at 11:30 at The Biblical Arts Center.



An amazing program was presented by Kit Sawyer, President of Klyde Warren Park Foundation. She oversees the daily operations, events and fundraising for the 5.2 acre deck park in downtown Dallas.

In addition Sawyer is playing a major roll in the \$100 million expansion. She is a Dallas native, graduate of SMU School of Law, the University of Virginia and The Hockaday School. She has chaired many area non-profits such as United Way and the Super Bowl.

Events are planned year round for the Public/Private Park such as the May 26, Music Fest that hosted over 40,000 people plus the June 29 (first every) FireWorks from 4 to 10. Access to many different area parking places is new with a \$10 fee for all parking. The Food Truck Rally, the Park and Palate, the Food and Wine event, the Holiday Show and Tree Lighting make Klyde Warren Park a safe and fun destination each week for the whole families, ages and stages and cultural groups.

The most exciting news: Phase Two and the extension over the Freeway is underway with 1.2. acres being added to the park. The design has not been set yet but it will include a much needed "Big Building" for indoor events with a bigger plaza area. The same architect for

the Hunt Oil Building will be used to complement this outstanding landmark downtown. It should be completed in 2023. On the first level will be a "Visit Dallas" Center providing a virtual experience of Dallas with a smart city theme with a half-price ticket booth for performances at the major venues downtown. The second level will host weddings, large events, with a coffee shop and food items. Heating and cooling will not be a problem with this new "Big Building" and weather will not be an issue.

The top deck will be open area but with a halo of shade around the edges with artificial turf for a glass of wine to enjoy the outstanding view of the sunset from downtown.

Of note, there will be small space below ground level with 25 parking spots and a delivery area plus a "Ride Share" drop off and pick up area.

Around the US, other cities are coming to examine and create their own green spaces over freeways. Our public/private effort are a model with 30 recent Deck parks being added in the last few years nationwide. Our park is open until 11 p.m. and Ms. Sawyer stressed how safe people feel. They respect and take pride in welcome and caring for the Park and each other. The City of Dallas will eventually own Klyde Warren. There are also four new parks greening up the downtown area. There is a growing desire to connect with bike and foot traffic from downtown extending to American Airlines and to the Katy Trail .
