PP **Phillip Bankhead** called the meeting to order. **Nolan Duck** gave the invocation, noting there were no new concerns. PP **Phillip** introduced our visitors and guests. **Mark Kashar** reported that there were three openings to advertise in The Hub and on the website.

PP **Phillip** presented **Eric Harrison** with his permanent badge.



Sarah Oliai gave an update on the parade and the volunteer opportunities still available. The Million Meal Challenge is currently **\$1,003,746+** meals. She also noted that **Tom Rhodes** would be taking over the plans for Goar Park. PCR Connect and a visit to the Perot Museum are still to come in June.

PP **Richard Stanford** introduced our speaker today, **Colin Cahoon**, who spoke on his book, *Mended Wings*. He said that his first two books are historical fiction,

but *Mended Wings* is about ten heroes in the Vietnam war. They are heroes, but they will all tell you they are not. He said that when he was in flight school in 1984, all the flight instructors were Vietnam vets. They made him the best army aviator he could be. There were forty thousand helicopter pilots in Viet Nam, and all volunteered. They wanted to fly. He has never met a pilot in Viet Nam who was not shot down at least once. About half of them never came back from combat missions. The men in the book are all alive today. They are all combat aviators in Viet Nam and all got shot down. Some received Purple Hearts. They will say that the heroes are the ones who didn't come back. The chapters are arranged by the date they were injured in combat. The book shows the whole arc of the war through their eyes. He put some historical perspective between each

chapter to give the context of the war and what was happening back home. Each chapter is organized in a specific way. He starts the chapter at the point they got injured. Then he stops the story and takes the reader back to their childhoods and where they grew up, their going to flight school and going to Viet Nam. Some got injured early in their service and some were injured in their second tours of duty. He tells you all about their experience in Viet Nam, all the way back to where they get hurt. Then he takes you with them after they are hurt and when they come back to the United States. It is a story about the generation. They have to deal with the mental and physical repatriation. Then he tells you what they did and where they are today. The veteran in the first chapter of his book grew up in Aurora, Colorado and loved to go fishing. More than anything else he wanted to be a pilot. He was a bright guy, but had poor grades and could not get into college. In those days if you couldn't get into college, you couldn't be a pilot. Eventually, he joined the National Guard and heard about a program called "High School to Flight School." So he went to flight school. His first duty station was in Korea. Soon he was assigned as the pilot for a general. Then he came back to Seattle and was assigned to a Huey Gunship. In battle his job was to suppress the enemy while the Good Guys landed. He was part of a large Huey force near the Cambodia border when they had to fly through an aerial ambush. His aircraft was on fire, but they continue their mission and they crash in the jungle between the two fighting forces. He was rescued after twenty-four hours, but had a broken back. Eventually, he became an air traffic controller with the FAA. The subject of another chapter got two Purple Hearts. He had a rough start and lost a lot of his friends. He was on a mission to rescue wounded soldiers. There was a clearing just large enough for one helicopter at a time. He was second, but when he landed machine gun fire started to hit him in his vest armor. He has blood running into his eyes and calls to the copilot to take over, but he is dead. He calls for the crew chief to read his instruments. He finally gets the all the wounded to the hospital.
