Bill Dendy LOVES Rotary. He joined Rotary in 2000 with the Rotary Club of Dallas. Bill served as District Governor in 2016-17. During that time, North Texas Rotary led our Rotary zone in membership growth. Additionally, the North Texas District was recognized as top district for public image in the paired zones. Furthermore, our District's Rotary Foundation giving grew with overall Foundation contributions increasing by over a million dollars. Bill attributes these successes to a strong supportive team that was necessary as he was also a full-time entrepreneur and active father for his two minor children during his governor year.

"Rotary should be uplifting and FUN," says Bill, and his team hosted several fun, memorable events. Beginning with his governor's installation presided over by RI President John Germ, our District saw hundreds in attendance at every major event, including the Foundation Celebration and the District Conference Cruise.

While fun and fellowship are important, Bill reminds us that, "service is the real focus." Most district events included an element of service, and individual Rotarians and clubs that excelled in service were recognized. Even the district conference was billed as a "Service Cruise," with five different service projects in Cozumel and Jamaica, spearheaded by clubs already familiar with the needs of those communities.

Bill's attitude of rolling up his sleeves and getting the job done benefited the district in several key areas. Bill found a charitable partner and traveled to Africa to fulfill a ten-year district goal of providing education for girls in Malawi. The scholarship project with Orant Charities continues today. Additionally, he led groups to Cuba to provide humanitarian aid and produced complimentary PR videos for dozens of clubs to highlight their many service accomplishments.

Bill continues to serve our Rotary Community. He is our 3-year District Representative for Rotary International's Council on Legislation and our District Foundation Chairperson. Bill is a Foundation Major Donor and a member of the Paul Harris Society, White Hat Society, and Bequest Society. He was District Rotarian of the Year in 2012, and in 2020, Bill received Rotary International's highest honor, the Service Above Self Award (only 150 worldwide per year).

Professionally, Bill is an Attorney, CPA and Certified Financial Planner. For fun, Bill enjoys travel and SCUBA. He is a member of American Mensa and is an instrument rated, multi-engine private pilot. His wife, Lisa, is an attorney and committed Rotarian.

President **Jeff McNaughton** called his first meeting of the year to order amid a standing ovation. PP **Karl von Bieberstein** gave the invocation. President **Jeff** collected Happy Bucks and introduced our visitors and guests, including Mark Moore, a former RCPC member who is now a member of the Cedar Creek RC.

Mark Kashar introduced our Marketplace Advertiser of the week, Todd Westerburg and Bank of America.

President **Jeff** introduced our newest member **Parthivi Patil**, who had joined previously and has now rejoined. She is currently working on a Masters degree in Engineering.



Parade Chair **Sarah Oliai** reported on the Parade. To date, along with the North Texas Food Bank's matching partners, RCPC has contributed \$35,531, which represents 1,006,000+ meals. She asked everyone who had participated in the planning, execution, or making a contribution to stand up, and the entire room was standing. She thanked everyone and reiterated that it takes all of the club members to put on a successful parade. PP **Cleve Clinton** followed up by saying he believes that there are three things that make a great parade: the first is a great parade; the second is a great person and a great organization to support it, and third, a lot of great nominees for the Grand Marshals. All of the Grand Marshals have been well-known and popular in the community. **William Taylor** suggested Donna Pierce. She has sent a text to read to the members, beginning "Why me?" It continued that being the GM had opened a part of her life she had not experienced, and she thanked the club for the experience. She continued that she heard so many stories and was greeted by so many of her former students or their families.

President **Jeff** introduced our speaker today, Katherine Adams, the co-founder of Paper for Water. She began with a short video of decorating a Christmas tree with their origami ornaments. She explained that when she and her sister learned that in parts of the world some girls were unable to attend school because they had to carry water all day. They thought that was unfair and wanted to do something to help. She also noted that 1.6 million people in the U.S. do not have access to running water. She said that over the last ten years they have raised over three million dollars and funded three hundred water projects in twenty countries around the world and have brought clean water to over 100,000 people. She said that it started just with her own family, but it has been interesting to watch as their volunteers have grown, so that now they have volunteers all over the world. They have also had the opportunity to have corporate sponsors. They took a year off of school and traveled the world to see a lot of their water projects first hand. She said that her favorite was a water project in Ethiopia. A woman had taken them to a bog hole in the ground which is where they had gotten their water. Animals and children had fallen in it. When they brought the water up, they strained it because it had works in it, but they could not strain out the amoebas. She had lost three of her children to waterborn disease. She explained how clean water had changed her community, that the children were now healthy and were attending school. When they started their organization, they were five and eight years old, but they realized that there were not very many ways for children to volunteer. They started a Changemaker's Council three years ago. They help with everything, fundraising and volunteering, and they also get to experience how a board works. They were on the Kelly Clarkson Show in April, 2022. They will be in a movie, also. They have a new project in Kenya which will repair a well put in previously. If the community has water, then they will be healthier will be able to grow crops.
