Sol Villasana is a civil trial attorney with 40 years of experience. He is Of Counsel in the WHITE & WIGGINS, LLP's Dallas office. He is a civil trial lawyer and certified mediator with years of experience in the Dallas and north Texas legal community. His primary practice areas include commercial litigation, including business and contract disputes, land use/zoning matters, insurance and subrogation, premises liability, and attorney disciplinary defense. Mr. Villasana regularly represents business entities before various governmental agencies. He also advises businesses on corporate and regulatory issues.

Mr. Villasana is a prolific writer and frequent speaker on a variety of legal and public policy issues. Summary of Mr. Villasana's book, Dallas's Little Mexico (Images of America):

Little Mexico was Dallas's earliest Mexican barrio. Mexicanos had lived in Dallas since the mid-19th century. The social displacement created by the Mexican Revolution of 1910, however, caused the emergence of a distinct and vibrant neighborhood on the edge of the city's downtown. This neighborhood consisted of modest homes, small businesses, churches, and schools, and further immigration from Mexico in the 1920s caused its population to boom. By the 1930s, Little Mexico's population had grown to over 15,000 people. *(cont. on pg 3)*

the RCPC award winners and the PHF recipients. He thanked especiallv Mark Neace for his work as the Public Image Chair for the District. He also thanked PP Happy Franklin, who is his assistant for all she does for him. He said that he had met with the RCPC Board and had a good conversation before coming to this general meeting.
