David Preziosi Texas Historical Foundation

David Preziosi, FAICP, Hon. AIA Dallas, just began a new role as the Executive Director of the Texas Historical Foundation after working for ten years as the Executive Director for Preservation Dallas. The Texas Historical Foundation works to preserve Texas history by awarding grants to nonprofits across the state for the preservation of buildings, archaeological sites, documents and artifacts, as well as providing funding for publications and films that document Texas history.

While at Preservation Dallas, David expanded programing and events, co-developed an Architectural Styles exhibit and booklet, worked on the creation of the Pegasus Urban Trails Mobile App for downtown Dallas, prepared a 50th anniversary film and booklet for Preservation Dallas and focused on advocacy efforts for Dallas' historic places. In 2020, Preservation Dallas receiv-ed the prestigious Trustees' Award for

Organizational Excellence from the National Trust for Historic Preservation.

Before returning to Texas in 2012, David worked for 16 years in Mississippi, first in City Planning for Natchez, Mississippi and later as the Executive Director of the Mississippi Heritage Trust where he worked across the state on education and advocacy for preserving Mississippi's historic places.

David holds a Bachelor of Environmental Design, a Master of Urban Planning, and a Historic Preservation Certificate, all from Texas A&M University. In 2018, he was inducted into the College of Fellows of the American Institute of Certified Planners. He was selected by the College of Architecture at Texas A&M in 2020 as an Outstanding Alumni. He was granted Honorary Membership with the AIA Dallas Chapter in 2021.

Valerie Pelan introduced our speaker today, Julie Percival who is the regional economist for the South-

west Information Office of the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics. She is also a ninth generation native Texan. She explained that the Bureau of Labor Statistics is a part of the Department of Labor. It is the principal fact finding agency for the government in labor economics and statistics. Its mission is to collect, analyze and disseminate labor market information to the public. They serve a lot of different audiences. BLS has a range of statistics about the jobs market which is published on Friday. They use several different surveys to collect the data. It looks at various demographics. Another is the We had a lot of new members today. Valerie current employment survey which looks at employment and real earnings. Unemployment rates have been below the U.S. rates before and after COVID. DFW has done really well in its employment recovery from COVID. DFW is at the highest employment rate of the U.S. What makes up most of the economy in DFW are is in three areas: trade, transportation and utilities; professional and business services; and education and health services. However, leisure and hospitality has seen the greatest growth over the last year. New hires are up over last year and openings are up, also. There are a tremendous number of job openings right now, about two openings for every unemployed person. Seven out of ten of the openings pay less than \$20 an hour, \$40,000 a year. Average expenditures for the DFW area are \$52,000 a year. A lot of that is related to necessary spending. The highest paid occupations are chief executive and physicians. BLS has a lot of information on inflation, including the Consumer Price Index, the Producer Price Index, Import and Export Prices, and Employment Cost Trends. All of them are used to measure inflation. They have extremely detailed indices which are helpful to many businesses. Their latest measures of inflation are up by a lot. The U.S. CPI is 9.1%. Some of them are at historic highs. When prices go up, wages do not go up as fast, causing difficulty

HE WHO LAUGHS, LASTS

The tribal wisdom of the Dakota Indians. passed on from one generation to the next, says that when you discover that you are riding a dead horse, the best strategy is to dismount.

But in modern business, because heavy investment factors are taken into consideration, other strategies are often tried with dead horses, including the following:

- 1. Buying a stronger whip.
- 2. Changing riders.
- 3. Threatening the horse with termination.
- 4. Appointing a committee to study the horse.


