# **Scott Murray**Sports Champions Share Kindness, Civility, Respect

From US presidents to U.S. Opens the World Series to the World Cup, the Olympic Games to 35 straight Super Bowls, Scott Murray has covered them all. He spent three decades with NBC television as a multi-Emmy Award-winning television sports anchor and broadcast journalist. Scott's been named Sportscaster of the Year 17 times

by multiple news organizations. He's also been recognized as a Living Legend of Journalism by the Press Club of Dallas and is a recipient of the prestigious Silver Circle Lifetime Achievement Award from the National Academy of Television Arts and Sciences.

Scott is presently co-host of a radio/Roku TV program, "Journey Through Sports, Entertainment and Life," that airs weekly on over 800 stations nationwide. He also regularly serves as an emcee/host/moderator for hundreds of corporate conferences and charitable events. In addition, he remains a sought-after key-note speaker and leadership facilitator of his presentation, "Leadership America... Creating Champions of Change Through a Culture of Civility." In addition, he's a published author of two books (Whatever It Takes: Life Lessons Learned through Sports Legends and Bring Out The Best) and is about to publish his third.


