Mark Melton is a partner in Holland & Knight's Dallas office. He focuses on corporate and federal income taxation issues related to domestic and international trans-=actions of private equity and hedge funds, as well as other investment partnerships, joint ventures, real estate investment trusts (REITs) and operating businesses.

Mark is also the founder of the Dallas Eviction Advocacy Center, which provides free legal representation to tenants facing eviction in Dallas County. Since March of 2020 when he began this work, his team has assisted more than 15,000 families facing eviction.

above the national average, and the labor force grew at the fastest pace in decades. However return to trend growth is likely in 2024, but the medium and long term factors still favor

the region. Texas's job growth in 2023 exceeded expectations. Inflation grew also. Compared to other states, Texas is about fifth in job growth. Among metropolitan areas in Texas, Brownsville was highest in job growth, while Austin, DFW and Houston lost jobs due to the loss of tech jobs. Typically, growth in the labor force is less than one percent, but last year the growth in the labor force in Texas was 3.4%. It and international migration. Construction values are high even though interest rates have increased from very low to five percent. There were spikes in non-residential construction in 2022 and 2023. Home sales have gone down in 2023, but building of single family homes has increased. Builders are building smaller homes and the cost of construction materials has gone down guite a bit. That makes it possible to sell what they build. House prices are pretty stable. When the Fed started raising interest rates, people were predicting a decrease in the housing market, but this has not really happened. Apartment rent rates are actually falling in many of the metropolitan areas. This is probably not due to declines in demand, but is due to overbuilding. Vacancy rates are going up for apartments, but this is just a factor of supply and demand. Office vacancy rates have finally stabilized in the fourth guarter of 2023. In 2023 Texas oil and gas production surpassed the pre-pandemic peak. A few years ago, oil producers in Texas were very pessimistic about their future, but the demand for American oil and gas is still there. When we have high energy production, we have high exports. Texas is the highest exporeconomic activity is slowing, but is still robust. ting state in the nation and 50% of the exports are energy related.

Solar Cell Phone Chargers Help Ukrainians excerpted from Rotary Voices from Jerry W. Venters, PDG of 6040 and member of the Rotary Club of Lander, WY

tended the 2023 Dist. 5440 Conference where an international project found us.

A Peace Corps volunteer in Ukraine told about a program to convert used solar panels into cell phone chargers for the people of Ukraine. The program, developed in coordination with a professor and students at Western Colorado Uni-versity in Gunnison, Colorado, was still in its infancy and only a very few chargers had been shipped to Ukraine.

The Ukrainian power grid remains a target of Russian airstrikes, and blackouts are common. Gas generators are more expensive, harder to ship, less mobile, and require fuel which is in limited supply. Solar chargers are easier to move and relatively inexpensive to re-


