environmental nonprofit based in Texas dedicated to educating and inspiring action for a sustainable future. EarthX Expo, Conference and Film Festival is the one place where environmental organizations, businesses and educational institutions come together to celebrate and share conservation practices and sustainable solutions that elicit true change. In 2017, EarthX hosted more than 900 organizations, 250 speakers, 61 features and film showcasing green practices to an audience of 116,000.

Kornajcik is passionate about the environment and works closely with EarthX founder Trammell S. Crow to reach, educate and inspire North Texas and beyond with tips that can help one family to huge corporations be-




