






David McCloskey, Author *Damascus Station*

David McCloskey is a former CIA analyst and former consultant at McKinsey & Company. While at the CIA, he wrote regularly for the President's Daily Brief, delivered classified testimony to Congressional oversight committees, and briefed senior White House officials, Ambassadors, military officials, and Arab royalty. He worked in CIA field stations across the Middle East throughout the Arab Spring and conducted a rotation in the Counterterrorism Center focused on the jihad in Syria and Iraq. During his time at McKinsey, David advised national security, aerospace, and transportation clients on a range of strategic and operational issues.

David holds an M.A. from the Johns Hopkins School for Advanced International Studies, where he specialized in energy policy and the Middle East. He lives in Texas with his wife and three children.

PP Phillip Bankhead gave his Membership Minute. He said this is his twentieth year in Rotary, but he was slow to join. His father was in Rotary. He advised new members not to be intimidated by the size of the group, but to find something interesting to you and get involved.

> Mark Neace introduced our speaker today, Robyn Short. She began by saying that she wants to make the world a better place through business. She said studies

have shown that people need security and safety. A lot of people are making a change in their work. Thirty-eight million people left their jobs last year, but are planning to go back to work but differently. Sixty-seven percent of the American workforce is disengaged at work. This costs businesses in money and human potential. People have basic needs in all aspects of life, and when they are not met they leave. They need to experience love and esteem in the workplace. Love is sharing one or more positive emotions. When we have trust in the workplace, everyone shares, but when there is little trust, it is very stressful. The resonance of positive emotions is when you do something that supports your dignity. Sharing positive emotions becomes a selfperpetuating cycle. You must take the time to build relationships. Many people are disconnected; there is enormous fragmentation in the workplace. People leave to find connections elsewhere. She said that if you have to use Zoom for a meeting, turn the camera on and keep all of the microphones on, if possible. It can engage about twelve people, so you must design smaller meetings. Take longer pauses in the discussions. When you are looking for a new job, ask how they feel about the leadership and their colleagues.


