Jeremy Strick A Conversation About the Nasher

Jeremy Strick has been the director of the Nasher Sculpture Center since 2009, overseeing collections, exhibitions, and operations at the museum of modern and contemporary sculpture located in the heart of downtown Dallas' Arts District. As director, Strick has organized ambitious exhibitions of sculpture, launched innovative new programming initiatives and, in 2015, created the Nasher Prize, an international juried award dedicated exclusively to contemporary sculpture. The Nasher Prize Laureates include Doris Salcedo (2016), Pierre Huyghe (2017), Theaster Gates (2018), Isa Genzken (2019), Michael Rakowitz (2020/2021), Isa Genzken (2022) and Senga Nengudi (2023).

Mr. Strick has been instrumental in conceiving and implementing major new programming and initiatives for the museum. In celebration of its 10th anniversary in 2013, Mr. Strick organized Nasher XChange, commissioning ten artists to create works that were installed in public spaces throughout Dallas. Nasher XChange extended the museum's core mission beyond its walls and into the surrounding community, presenting key advances in the rapidly expanding field of sculpture. in the public realm, and contributing to broader national and international conversations on sculpture in the public sphere.

In 2020, during the COVID-19 pandemic, Strick launched another public art program, Nasher Public, a two-pronged public art initiative which aims to generate access to public

art by North Texas artists at the Nasher and throughout the greater Dallas community in partnership with area businesses and organizations and which is actively addressing community opportunities for art today.

Mr. Strick introduced contemporary art programs to the Nasher, which under his direction organized major exhibitions of major artists, as well as initiated the groundbreaking exhibition First Sculpture: Handaxe to Figure Stone in 2018, which was lauded by The New York Times as an "intelligent, imprudent and thoroughly enjoyable exhibition."

In 2010, Mr. Strick also launched Sightings, a series of small-scale exhibitions and installations that explore new work by established and emerging sculptors. Mr. Strick also created 360: Artists, Critics, Curators, a monthly lecture series featu-ring art world visionaries engaged in conversations on contemporary issues pertinent to the field of sculpture.

Prior to becoming Director of the Nasher, Mr. Strick served as Director of The Museum of Contemporary Art (MOCA) in Los Angeles, California for more than nine years. Throughout his tenure, MOCA received international acclaim for its exhibition program, which included such landmark shows as Martin Kippenberger: The Problem Perspective (2008); Marlene Dumas: Measuring Your Own Grave (2008) www.nashersculpturecenter.org

The Rotary Club in Ukraine has distributed the funds to provide medicine and medical equipment, ambulances, heating fuel and other needed items. PP Greg then presented Van Oliver with his third level Paul Harris pin.

Mary Bishop introduced our advertiser of the week, PP Happy Franklin, a financial advisor with Navigation Financial Group.

PE Nolan introduced Walt Marcum to give his new member speech. Walt began by saying he was from Odessa, TX, where people knew the difference between a sand storm and a dust storm. He at-

Ed Fjordbak introduced our speaker today, Ann Drumm to speak about American Promise. She said she was here to speak about mon-

ey and politics. American Promise, a national nonpartisan organization committed to restoring the people's voice in govern-

ment. Money from special interest groups is drowning out the voices of ordinary Americans. Americans across the political spectrum want to fix this problem. Fixing it will allow us to make headway on many issues that Americans really care about. Americans have lost faith in grants which are goal oriented. RI also makes politics and government. America is a republic, which is based on representation. Our Founders created a revolutionary idea. Nobody had created a system of governance based on the Ukraine area. Two years after Russia invaded idea of popular sovereignty. They implemented this through representation, where there is a relationship between constituents and their representatives. This relationship is being undermined by dark money groups, money from outside the district, and super pacs. The grip of money on the political system has become a threat to democracy. The recent elections have had the most money spent on them in history. Dark money is money where the source of it is not known. Super Pacs and Dark Money groups can give unlimited amounts of money. In 1976 the court equated money with speech and so could not be regulated. Congress cannot fix this. Their Constitutional Amendment will restore the ability to regulate the money.
