Please remember ...

Happy Franklin introduced our speaker, Kelly Accetta, Author and Life Coach who inspires sales teams. She wrote the book "How to Diffuse Land Mines We Plant in Our



Lives" because she saw so many people tripping themselves up over the same things, especially women. There are a number of things over which we have no control. However, she wants to show us how to diffuse "land mines", which

are things we can have control over.

The first landmine is Insecurity. Someone can go into a board meeting knowing an attendee is not a fan - which can affect one's presentation. Someone could feel insecure when there is a meeting to which they have not been invited. Often children of divorce or abandonment carry feelings into adulthood that can affect future business or personal relationships.

The second landmine is Comparison. Individuals compare themselves to people they see on social media who appear to be the best at everything. Giving every child a trophy deprives them of learning they sometimes have to lose, in order to desire to do better.

The third landmine is negative Self-Talk (gossip, doubt, bitterness, unforgiveness). If someone has a number of personal losses, such as divorce or career setback, negative self-talk can derail chances of recovery. Reign in negative self-talk by taking on new challenges, such as hiking a mountain to help overcome fear of heights, to improve overall self-image.
