Randy Mayeux, Leadership Development, Author Review of Best Books on Leadership Development

Randy truly is the epitome of a lifelong learner. Starting with his love of comic books as a young child, (he once owned a first edition of Fantastic Four; sadly, it is long ago misplaced), he progressed through the Hardy Boys, to Nero Wolfe, and then to a much wider array of books. (Admittedly, he has neglected far too many novels). But in multiple areas of nonfiction, including theology, and business, and general nonfiction, he has been an avid reader throughout his life.

As an outgrowth of his wide interests, in addition to his "regular" offerings, among other subjects, he has presented extended presentations on the threat of Al- Qaeda, the ongoing energy challenges, the financial crash and ongoing crisis of the last few years and the challenges facing the health care industry in this country.

You might simply say that Randy is unendingly curious. His curiosity is what drives his life-long-learning passion. But, for his

"regular" presentations, since April, 1998 Randy has been one half of the First Friday Book Synopsis team, presenting one new business book briefing each month. That's 18 years, and counting! In addition since 2004, Randy has presented book briefings focused on social justice and poverty, at the Urban Engagement Book Club for CitySquare, (formerly Central Dallas Ministries). His unique academic and professional background, from theology to rhetoric to business, has shaped his diversity and breadth in his offerings.

Though Randy provides extended sessions in a number of areas, it is his wide and consistent experiences with book synopses/briefings that keep him current, month after month, year after year. And his book briefings allow him to address a wide array of business issues – issues faced by every organization in every sector.

Happy Franklin introduced our speaker, **Kelly Accetta**, Author and Life Coach who inspires sales teams. She wrote the book "How to Diffuse Land Mines We Plant in Our



Lives" because she saw so many people tripping themselves up over the same things, especially women. There are a number of things over which we have no control. However, she wants to show us how to diffuse "land mines", which are things we can have control over.

The first landmine is **Insecurity**. Someone can go into a board meeting knowing an attendee is not a fan - which can affect one's presentation. Someone could feel insecure when there is a meeting to which they have not been invited. Often children of divorce or abandonment carry feelings into adulthood that can affect future business or personal relationships.

The second landmine is **Comparison**. Individuals compare themselves to people they see on social media who appear to be the best at everything. Giving every child a trophy deprives them of learning they sometimes have to lose, in order to desire to do better.

The third landmine is negative **Self-Talk** (gossip, doubt, bitterness, unforgiveness). If someone has a number of personal losses, such as divorce or career setback, negative self-talk can derail chances of recovery. Reign in negative self-talk by taking on new challenges, such as hiking a mountain to help overcome fear of heights, to improve overall self-image.
