

in the Arts District. Mr. Srtick and his staff have organized many ambitious exhibitions, innovating programing, plus Nasher Prize for the best contemporary sculpture. He gave an overview with

visuals of the permanent collection and the outstanding exhibits and shows through the years. He asked "Why does it matter?' The impulse to create art is a universal desire of man and dates back to prehistoric time. He showed us a 'beautiful stone tool' created to cut meat but the artist took great care and the effort far exceeded its purpose.

Sculptures of ancient civilization told their history, their conquests, their daily life and depicted their Gods, leaders and aspirations, humans and animals in the traditional way using bronze, wood, ceramic, stone. But starting around Pablo Picasso and the cubism movement, we see inventive and creative new techniques and materials being experimented with such as steal girders, resin, resin and wood, glass using industrial techniques. He showed slides of modern exhibits that are designed to engage the viewer: a room filled with balloons, or a room with colored dirt, or ropes to walk in and over using booties or architectural space for social interaction among the carefully designed wooden beams. One of the most successful projects was the Nasher XChange. Ten artists were commissioned to create works that were installed in public spaces throughout Dallas. One sculpture in Vickery Park captured the various ethnic groups that had immigrated to that area. Another art installation of 'A Painted Pier' at White Rock Lake, or the giant 'Tin man' in Deep Ellum evoked interest and surprise. My favorite example was the sculptures at a hos-(continued on page 3)


