Paul Hoffmann, Executive Director Agape Clinic

Paul Hoffman, MSSW, MBA, is the Executive Director of Agape Clinic. In this role, he is responsible for managing a paid staff of 12 and 120 volunteers. He oversees a budget of \$1 million, and is responsible for fundraising \$700,000 annualy. He also creates and maintains multiple partnerships with health care and social service organizations and churches. He facilitates strategic planning and implements the plans for Agape Clinic.

Prior to coming to Agape Clinic, he served from 2013 to 2020 as Administrative Director of Extramural Clinics at Texas A & M University College of Dentistry, where he created and managed four new community dental clinics. Dental students and residents served rotations in the clinics under faculty supervision by the Department of Public Health Sciences in collaboration with local community-based health centers in the Dallas area. He was instrumental in their fundraising efforts, including using Medicaid funding to create and expand four program areas and obtaining a federal grant to enhance Inter-professional education at North Dallas Shared Ministries in collaboration with the UT-Southwestern, He secured United Way funding to enhance dental services

to uninsured children and adults, and also ssisted with the capital campaign for the Agape Clinic to purchase a building to expand medical, dental, behavioral health and social services.

As a part of his profeseeional career, he was the Executve Director of Community Dental Care, Director of Strategic Planning and Development of the Parkland Health & Hospital System, Executive Director of Oak Cliff Clinics, Inc, and Executive Director of Neighborhood Health Horizons, Inc.

He has been an adjunct professor in the School of Allied Health at UT-Southwestern Medical School. He has consulted to improve medical delivery with a variety of hospital and healthcare systems, community health departments and foundations in Texas.

He attended the University of North Texas for his undergraduate degree, and then went on to receive a Master of Science in Social Work and a Master of Business Administration at UT-Arlington.

He has served on the Boards and as a part of the Executive Teams of many community organizations in Dallas.

Some of their best known programs are 'Little Red School House', 'Newsroom' with Jim Lehrer, and British comedy shows like 'Monty Python', 'Think', and the always popular 'WWR' 101 Classical Radio plus a new addition called 'Local Art'.

KERA interacts with all age ranges in many (childlrens to adults) different and diverse ways. The staff of thirty-five in the newsroom cover local, county, city and state news. Our state is changing demographics so the leadership must assess and appeal to a broader range of interests. PBS-TV show local current productions and highlights metroplex artists and musicians. The podcast 'Think' has added a new show that covers sports. KERA reaches over 600,000 kids with programs that the parents trust to be of high and safe quality plus reach out directly to the schools. The funding must be raised from private donors and foundations with no funds coming from the City of Dallas. Of note, many rural communities rely totally on Public Broadcasting for programing.

Since 1968, the Corporation for Public Broadcasting has been the steward of the federal government's investment in public broadcasting. CPB provides essential support for the nearly 1,500 public television and radio stations across the United States, which reach virtually every household in the country. CPB's mission is to ensure universal access to noncommercial, high-quality programs and services. KERA is a recipient of CPB grant funding, which represents vital support to maintain our service for North Texas. CPB's grant helps to provide everyone in our community with a unique source for trusted news, smart entertainment and lifelong learning regardless of their ability to pay.
