Program Chair of the Day: Richard Stanford



**J.D. Trueblood**, President, CEO - Turtle Creek Assoc. The New Turtle Creek Corridor

JD Trueblood was a recognized leader in insurance operations for State Farm Insurance. Throughout his 33-year career with them, he enjoyed an exceptional record of excellence in all facets of operations, from business development, recruiting, agency resources, and sales & Marketing.

As Director of Operations for Agency Services for State Farm, JD oversaw a multi-million-dollar budget and managed 16 direct and 505 indirect reports. He created and implemented aggressive growth strategies for State Farm's agents in this role. JD realigned service goals, compensation structures, and contract adjustments with agency vice presidents. Within State Farm, he was known as a turnaround expert, taking on underperforming divisions and transforming them into centers of excellence.

A career-high occurred as National Director of Recruiting for State Farm. In this role, JD oversaw the creation of a corporate strategy to recruit veterans, transitioning service members and their families into corporate employment. His military campaign resulted in broad media coverage, three separate invitations to present at the Pentagon. He shared the stage with former First Lady Michelle Obama, on an aircraft carrier, as a keynote speaker for Hire America's Heroes. These efforts gainfully employed over 5,000 military men and women.

In post-retirement, JD assumed the President/CEO position of the Turtle Creek Association in June of 2019. Under his leadership, he's implemented non-profit software and developed a holistic marketing plan that included a new logo, website, and social media platforms. In addition, he created a five-year strategic plan that is focused on the health of Turtle Creek, reversing urban decay, and the installation of art throughout the corridor. As a result, membership has tripled, donations have doubled and the organization recently received its largest grant from Lyda Hill Philanthropies to revitalize the Historic Turtle Creek Corridor.

JD is a Chartered Life Underwriter, Chartered Financial Accountant, Chartered Property Casualty Underwriter, and is a Six Sigma Black Belt. He earned a Bachelor of Science in Business Administration and Management at Indiana State University.

Today's speaker, Curt Hazelbaker, is President and CEO of the YMCA of Metropolitan Dallas. The YMCA was founded in England in 1844 and came to the USA to Bos-

1885 and the Park Cities Y in 1944. Curt started as a camper with the Y and as counselor making it his life career. Swimming lessons. camps, after school programing and classes for adults have been the mainstav of the "Y". A very few cities do have hotels or hostel type sleeping arrangements. During the pandemic, all facilities had to close and all part-time employees were furloughed. The childcare facilities had to remain open for the children of essential workers and the reduced permanent staff had to take up the slack. South Dallas was in a food crisis and the "Y" gave out food and supplies to families in need. Three "Y"s were permanently closed.

Revenues fell because fees and dues make up 85% of the income. It was a bleak financial picture with the needs far out pacing the revenue. On December 10, 2020, a foundation run by Mackenzie Scott (Jeff Bezo's exwife) called and offered to donate 10 million to the Dallas Metropolitan Y. The explanation was the quality of programing, and the great leadership of this organization had come up as one of the best places for them to invest with no strings attached. The "Y" now has a 2 1/2 million endowment fund, the Rise School at the Moody "Y", a Virtual presence for inhome programming, a Mobile Y for computer training for children and adults plus a new box truck for food distribution. Money has been raised for mental health for elementary age and teenagers. Swimming lessons will be offered at apartments in South Dallas plus a free swimsuit. The biggest challenge is staffing and retention while competing with the private sector. With the supply chain problem, new equipment is delayed. The good news is the Y is growing. They have been recognized for the vital role they play in the community.







## HE WHO LAUGHS, LASTS
