The Value Proposition for Diversity

Richie Butler is Senior Pastor of the historic St. Luke "Community" United Methodist Church in Dallas and Founder of Project Unity.

Richie has over 20 years of experience in private equity real estate investment management. He has been responsible for nearly \$1 billion of institutional real estate investment and fund management activity throughout the U.S.

Under his visionary leadership Project Unity offers community building and Diversity Equity and Inclusion (DEI) solutions through its "Together We" programs including Together We Ball, Together We Dine, Together We Learn, and Together We Sing.

As a civic leader, in response to the five Dallas police officers who were ambushed in 2016, Richie launched the Year of Unity a community wide initiative to help bridge racial divides in Dallas. The initiative included support from the 43rd President of the United States, George W. Bush, who served as the Honorary Chair

During the pandemic, he launched the Together We Test and Together We Vaccinate programs to help address the lack of COVID-19 testing and vaccinations in low-income communities. Combined, these programs tested and vaccinated over 10,000 individuals. In 2021, he co-launched the Together We Can

initiative to address the "what can I do" question people began to ask in response to the death of George Floyd. The Together We Can program has attracted Fortune 500 companies, universities, foundations, and grassroot organizations as partners.

Richie's current board appointments include Southern Methodist University Board of Trustees, Communities Foundation of Texas Board of Trustees-Chairman, Texas Methodist Foundation Board of Trustees, and an Independent Board of Director of Brookshire Grocery Company.

He is a recipient of the 2021 Dallas Business Journal's Leaders in Diversity Award and the 2021 Collin County Business Alliance Leadership Award. He is also a past recipient of the SMU Distinguished Alumni Emerging Leader Award, the Minority Business Leader award from the Dallas Business Journal and a Dallas Bar Association Martin Luther King, Jr. Justice Award recipient.

Richie holds degrees from Southern Methodist University and Harvard University with extended studies in Urban Planning at MIT.

Richie is married to Neisha Strambler-Butler. They have two young adults, Emily and Ford

they once thought were out of reach. Even more exciting, 100% of these interns reported increased confidence in pursuing STEM fields.

Jeff Brady introduced our speaker today, Tom Foley to speak on "Behind the Scenes in the Restaurant Busi-

ness." He began by saving he wanted to share three things he did not know when he started in the restaurant business and three things we should know about it, The first thing he did not know was that everyday would be on fire.. He said in the restaurant business every day something is going to go wrong. We know things break and we know people break things. The second is that the show must go on. Every day you are hosting a party. People are coming. Reservations have been made and confirmed. They are coming; you can't stop them. However, two members of the staff have not shown up. Yet you have to serve the guests anyway. The third thing is "No call, no show, no job." The employee handbook now has that in it. You need reliable staff but flexibility is the key in the restaurant business. He was invited to speak to a class learning about the restaurant business. He asked them what they would do to be successful. The students mentioned hiring the best chef. He asked them if a friend told you about a new restaurant. You go and your friend loves the food but yours is not that great, would you give them a second chance? Most said they would. What if the food was great, but the service was not? He asked if they would give it a second try, and all said they would not. Part of the servers job is to make the customer feel good. Going to a restaurant is about the experience. He said that if you enjoyed the restaurant and rate them, give them five stars. The stars are important for future customers. A restaurant needs to have 4.7 stars or higher to succeed. Customers need to recognize that the restaurant is not their business. They should trust that every decision has been thought out and is not really open for suggestions. They order based on what they can sell. If something isn't selling, they have to figure out why.

"Thank you' continued from Front Page \finished high school," she says. "I wanted to break barriers."

The rigorous AP classes at Rangel were demanding. yet Yatziri emerged stronger.

Her transformation accelerated when she earned a research internship at UT Southwestern – an opportunity that Rotary Club of Park Cities made possible. "My internship taaught me to be more confident speaking to strangers and in myself.: she reflects. "I conducted myself in a professional environment, discovered more about the medical field, and gained unique experiences I could highlight on my college applications."

That preparation paid off, one evening in her father's apartment, she opened the email that would change her life, a full-ride scholarship to Case Western Reserve University. She looked at her dad and yelled, "I'm going to OHIO!"

He responded with the words that have always fueled her:

"Lo mismo que hacemos cada noche: tratar a conquistar el mundo."


