Our mission of The Rotary Foundation helps Rotary members to advance world understanding, goodwill, and peace by improving health, providing quality education, improving the environment, and alleviating poverty.

The Rotary Foundation transforms your gifts into projects that change lives both close to home and around the world. As the charitable arm of Rotary, we tap into a global network of Rotarians who invest their time, money, and expertise into our priorities as listed below. Strong financial oversight, a stellar charity rating, and a unique funding model make the very most of your contribution.

The Rotary Foundation has seven areas of global focus:

- Peace and conflict prevention/resolution.
- · Disease prevention and treatment.
- Water and sanitation.
- Maternal and child health.

- Basic education and literacy.
- · Economic and community development.
- Protect the Environment

## **Programs of the Rotary Foundation**

PolioPlus: Since 1988, Rotary and our partners have immunized nearly 3 billion children against polio. As of June 2024, Rotary had committed more than \$2.6 billion to global polio eradication.

Rotary Peace Centers: Each year, the Foundation supports the training of peace fellows at Rotary Peace Centers, where they earn master's degrees or professional development certificates. Since 2002-03, 1,800 fellows from more than 140 countries have participated

District grants: District grants support small-scale, short-term projects. In 2023-24, the Foundation approved 485 district grants, and program awards totaled \$29.2 million.

Global grants: Global grants fund large-scale international which include humanitarian projects, scholarships, and vocational training teams. In 2023-24, the Foundation approved 1,287 global grants, and program awards totaled \$72.1 million. Disaster response grants: Rotary's disaster response grants support relief and recovery efforts within the past six months. In 2023-24, the Foundation approved 106 disaster response grants.






