## Paul Reed, Vietnam Veteran Tiny Diary Unites, Heals Enemy Soldiers

Born in Dallas, Paul Reed attended Hillcrest High School. Upon graduating he joined the US military to become an Infantry Paratrooper. He served the nation between the ages of 18 through 21, leaving the armed services a proud-to-have-served Sergeant E-5 with an Honorable Discharge.

His challenges with post-traumatic stress disorder or PTSD, as its known, began during the Vietnam war and eventually led to his unemployment and homelessness. Paul has since published two books and associate produced two PBS documentaries, one earning an Emmy award, a Gold Camera award, and a Gold Medal award. He has traveled internationally, telling his story of forgiveness and reconciliation with his former Vietnamese enemy

His books include Kontum Diary: Captured Writings Bring Peace to a Vietnam Veteran, published in 1996. His recent book, The Healing Box: When Flowers Bloom Again in the Killing Fields came out in paperback in 2021.

Paul showed his forgiveness film (now on YouTube) to a Jerusalem audience of Arabs, Jews and Christians. His story has been featured on The Today Show, on Dan Rather's 48 Hours, in People Magazine and in countless media coverage.

His military honors include the Bronze Star, the Purple Heart, the Air Medal, the Good Conduct Medal, the Combat Infantry-man's Badge or CIB, and, among others, the National Defense Medal, the Vietnam Campaign Medal, the Vietnam Service Medal, the Parachute Badge, a Jump Master's qualification and the foreign unit award, the Vietnamese Cross of Gallantry.

As a civilian, Reed's most cherished civilian tributes are the "Hero of Forgiveness" award from the Worldwide Forgiveness Alliance, and the "Legion of Honor Award" from the Chapel of Four Chaplains. He was presented with the Congressional Veterans Commendation Award by former (now deceased) Vietnam POW and United States Congressman Sam Johnson for exceptional service to the country and community, both past and present.

Paul has made at least ten trips to visit his former battlefield enemy, demonstrating their lasting friendship. Here at home, he founded a 501(c)(3) organization that provides trips to other Vietnam veterans to meet some of their former enemies and begin a healing process of their own.

PP Richard Stanford introduced our speaker today, RCPC member and Executive Director, Paul Hoffman, to give an update on Agape Clinic.

Agape Clinic opened in 1983 in the basement of Grace UMC to treat and provide free healthcare on Saturdays. By 2000, partnerships had grown with Dallas County Health, Labcorp, Americares, Direct Relief and Baylor Community Care. The Clinic expanded to four days a week. In 2015 Agape launched a capital campaign and purchased its 10,000 square foot building across the street from Grace UMC. This provided the

clinic with thirteen medical exam rooms, seven complete dental suites, and a multipurpose medical space. The clinic expanded their healthcare services to six days a week. In 2017 a refugee clinic was added: the clinic was open seven days a week. In 2021 com-prehensive, family-centered healthcare ser-vices began. including Women's Wellness and Pediatrics. In 2022 Agape Clinic was the Crys-tal Charity Ball Award winner, Beginning in the summer of 2024, comprehensive dental ser-vices will be available due to a grant from an anonymous family foundation. Due to partner-ships, most medicines and labs are free to Agape patients. Agape is the only charity clinic that provides integrated healthcare services, including medical, pediatrics, behavioral health and dental without ANY restrictions as to zip code, income, insurance, sliding fee scale, etc. To ensure that financial constraints do not prevent anyone from accessing services, Agape asks for a patient donation to help pay for services. Services are always provided regardless of a patient's ability to pay or make a donation. Agape patients donate 30% of the clinic's overall operating budget. Agape is able to provide comprehensive healthcare within the medically underserved community by brid-ging the financial gap (70%) through generous donations from foundations, organizations and private donors. Due to this funding, Agape provided over \$8.6 million in healthcare to those most vulnerable in 2023. Agape patients are less than 200% below the federal poverty level; 95% are minority, and 100% have co-morbidities.

The program ended in a tour.


