Leading with Questions: Leadership is Not as Much About Knowing the Right Answers as it is About Asking the Right Questions

Bob Tiede (pronounced Tee-Dee) has been on the staff of Cru for 52 years and serves on Cru's U.S. Leadership Development Team, where he has recruited over 130 Leaders from outside of Cru to coach 130+ Cru Leaders every other week with a commitment to do so for two years.

President Jeff McNaughton called the meeting to order at the North Tex-

as Food Bank. PP John Glancy gave the invocation and indicated there were no new concerns today. PP John then led the Pledge of Allegiance and "The Star Spanoled Banner." President Jeff then introduced our visitors and guests,

Michelle Brown introduced our Marketplace Advertiser of the Week. Karen Farris. the Chairman of the RHSB Foundation. and RHSB, an Assurex Global Partner.

President Jeff presented his permanent badge to Jack Carpenter, noting that he had accomplished the requirements in record time

Jill Jordan reminded us that the Parade beneficiary is the North Texas Food Bank. She encouraged everyone to donate using the QR code so RCPC could get credit. [See first page of The Hub or in the eBulletin.]

President Jeff reminded us that nominations for the club awards are due Friday, May 12. Please make your nominations! The awards will be given at the the Awards and Installation Lunch on June 23 at Ozona's.

President Jeff introduced our speaker

today, RCPC member, Trisha Cunningham, who is the President and CEO of the NTFB. She started by asking if we were surprised by the size of the building, which is VERY large! She explained that the X



front of the building is "Lula May's Mark." Lula



May was Ross Perot's mother. There was an X mark on the curb in front of their home. She didn't remove it because it indicated that if you were hungry and came to the

back door, you would be given some food.

The Food Bank provides food for thirteen counties covering 10,000 square miles.. It is estimated that one in eight north Texans are food insecure, and that one in five (about 257,030) children are food insecure. The Food Bank is forty years old. It was started by four women who saw food going to waste and wanted to give it to the hungry. In the first year they distributed 400,000 pounds of food. The current food bank distributed 345,000 pounds in one day in March. The food bank is a member of the Feeding America Network. Dallas has the fourth highest need, behind New York, Los Angeles and Houston. More than eighty percent of the food is distributed through over four hundred feeding partners. They want their customers to go to their neighborhood facilities to help them address the cause of hunger. The government gave them grants to buy food during the Pandemic. Now those grants have ended. but the need is as great or greater than ever. Now there is \$30 million to make up for the grants. They have brought in more efficiencies and have removed many things from the budget in order to buy food. Many people don't know how to get help. Many young people have to drop out of school to get a job in order to eat. How the community can help: 1) Participate in a virtual or sponsored food drive. Each dollar buys three meals, Volunteer at the food bank.

3) Advocate. Help generate awareness of the need. They need donations from many people.

The attendees were then treated to a tour. Trisha shows the pallets of


