# Lesley McCaslin

Life on the Sidelines with the Texas Rangers and Dallas Mavericks: A Reporter's / Host Perspective of the MLB & NBA

Lesley McCaslin is a sideline reporter and anchor for Bally Sports Southwest where she covers the Texas Rangers and the Dallas Mavericks. In 2023, she served as a field reporter for approximately half of the Texas Rangers telecasts on the field and many more as the host of the Rangers pre and post-game coverage on BSSW. She also hosted the playoff run and World Series Championship parade coverage in Arlington.

McCaslin, who has contributed to Rangers' programming for the last 11 years, is also the courtside reporter on Dallas Mavericks road broadcasts.

Previously, she was the courtside reporter and host for the Oklahoma City Thunder. She covered the team led by Kevin Durant and Russell Westbrook for seven years. During that time,

she won two Emmy Awards for live sporting events as a part of the broadcast team on then Fox Sports Oklahoma. McCaslin has also covered the sidelines of Big 12 college football games. Other career stops include News 8 in Austin and KTXS in Abilene where she started her career.

McCaslin also works for Dallas-based Benchmark Title in a business development role in commercial real estate.

Lesley grew up in Lubbock, Texas, and graduated from the University of Texas at Austin with degrees in Broadcast Journalism and Theater. She now lives in Dallas with her three children; a son, Hunter (7), and two daughters, Sullivan (4) and Harrison (2).

Janie Loveless introduced our speaker today, Paul Reed, a Vietnam veteran, to speak about his experience during and after the Viet Nam war. He

during and after the Viet Nam war. He said as soon as he had finished high school, he signed up to be a U.S. Army Airborn Paratrouper. During training, his instructors said the best warriors were angry warriors. When they came out of training, they hated the enemy and believed they deserved to die. At that time there was no communication with people back home. except through Snail Mail. He detailed the hardships of living through the war. He was on a recon mission when they found an enemy camp. They took all the backpacks and searched them. He found a plastic bag with photos and a small diary, written in Vietnamese. The writing was beautiful. He put it in a box and sent it to his parents. Twenty years later he was homeless and had lost everything. He was still angry. He was at home and his mother remembered the box. It was just like when he had sent it twenty years earlier. His mother suggested he get it translated. The translator said the writer of the diary was a good man. In the back of the book was a poem, titled "Love." He then showed a video of a "48 Hour" show. It told the story of his return to Viet Nam to meet the author of the diary, Nguyen Van Nghia. Paul found out that he was still alive and traveled to Viet Nam to meet him. When they met Nghia invited Paul into his home to meet his wife and family. Paul returned the contents of the box to him, including the diary. Paul saw that Nghia was having trouble reading it and learned that was almost blind from his injuries in that battle. After Nghia had recovered, he walked 500 miles back home. Paul asked if Nghia was angry at him. Nghia said to let the past be the past and forget the past, and move forward. They became friends. Paul wanted to help Nghia. He brought him to Dallas to help restore his sight, which was partly done.


