Shawn Foster introduced our speaker to-day, Bob Tiede. He began by saying that for much of his career he believed that a leader told people what to do. He changed in 2006 Dale Carnegie said "an effective leader will ask questions instead of giving direct orders. Leading requires both guestions and directions. When listening to lengthy directions, a person's mind wanders. Questions focus your attention and you start to think about the answer. If the person with the best answer is asked to implement it, they will work harder. Leaders who lead with guestions are ten times more effective than those who just give directions. When you ask questions, you might hear ideas you hadn't thought about. If you get everybody involved, you get even better ideas. When you ask questions, follow up by asking additional questions, Usually a person's first answer is "safe." It takes several questions before the person feels more comfortable and shares their best ideas. People feel valued when a leader asks them for their opinions. Keep questions simple; you don't need to ask complicated questions. If you ask a question which requires the person to think, give them time to respond. Otherwise, they are unlikely to think you wanted their answer. He quoted Henry David Thoreau who said, "The greatest compliment that was ever paid me was when one asked me what I thought and attended to my answer."


