# **Colin Allred**, US Congressman for TX-32 Congressional Update

Born and raised in North Dallas by a single mom who was a Dallas public school teacher, Congressman Colin Allred was student body president at Hillcrest High School and earned a full-ride football scholarship to Baylor University.

Diploma in hand and prepared to attend law school, Colin deferred his acceptance to play in the NFL. He was a linebacker for five seasons before sustaining a career-ending injury that opened the door for him to fulfill his other dream -- becoming a civil rights attorney.

Colin served in the General Counsel's office at the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development. Colin later returned home to Dallas and decided to run for office to represent the district he grew up in.

As a Representative, Colin is dedicated to helping North Texas families gain the same opportunities he had to fulfill his dreams. Colin's top priorities in Congress are working to lower health care costs, protecting Medicare and Social Security, and creating an economy that works for everyone. Colin is passionate about expanding access to vocational and trade schools and lowering the cost of college so all North Texans have the shot at a middle-class job. He believes Congress must find common ground to rebuild our aging roads and bridges, pass comprehensive immigration reform and take care of our veterans.


### **RCPC Is Back at Ronald McDonald House!**


Alice Freidline gave her Membership Minute, saving that when she was in the ninth grade, her father joined Rotary. He was a member for forty years. When she married Roger, he was a Rotarian and she became a Rotary-Ann. The Boy Scout leader invited her to visit Rotary. She said not to assume that someone would not want to join. When she and Roger moved to Dallas, they looked for a Rotary club as a place to make friends and to be involved in the community.

Daniel Drabinski introduced our speaker today, Rogers Healy, who spoke on "Geographic Trends and the DFW Lake and Ranch Market." He said that times have changed since when he spoke before. He got interested in real estate in high school. He said a moment that changed his life was when he was asked what was his superpower. He said it was giving prople confidence through real estate. He said that real estate has ben good to him. Even as crazu as it is right now, real estate is job security. He gave some "fun facts" about the real estate market: prices have risen over 25% in the last year; the median price per home is \$529,800; supply is at the lowest point we have ever had; rental rates are the highest they have ever been; the median days on the market is thirtyfour days. COVID shifted the home buying seasons; on average 343 people move to the DFW area every day; and forty percent of them are millenials. DFW is the only area that can grow all four ways; ninety miles north is the Oklahoma border, ninety miles south is Waco and ninety miles east is Tyler. Dallas as we knew it is gone. There is much more diversity and much more opportunity. Another effect of COVID is to change empty-nesters from wanting to downsize, to wanting to upsize or stay in their current homes. Working from home has created a need for a home office. Across the country retirees are upsizing. People from larger metropolitan areas do not have a problem moving to the suburbs. The fastest growing area in the U.S. has been St. Paul, Texas. Get Involved
