President Paul shared news from the District Awards held Saturday, May 9th. The club nomination process changed significantly this year and each club was asked to submit only one-page detailing club accomplishments for consideration. President of the Year was awarded. Drum roll ... we won the "Service Above Self" award, which is less specific than most awards, it commends an overall success. The new banner was unveiled.

John Gilchrist introduced our speaker, Nanette W. Foght, Director of Development for the Voice of Hope Ministries a Chris-

tian based after school and out of school care non-profit organization that provides character development and faith-based education to low income children from pre-k to twelfth grade in West Dallas. They currently serve a total of 400

students per week. They are located in the zip code 75212, one that is designated as a "food desert". Ms. Foght said we all want to change the world; Voice of Hope believes it begins with children. The nonprofit started in 1982 as a vacation bible study and has grown into the ASPIRE after-school program and Summer Day Camp. She reviewed the six pillars of character taught each child and how to live the positive behavior. They are Respect, Citizenship, Integrity, Responsibility, Fairness and Caring. Ms. Foght said they have added social and emotional learning as essential skills to develop self-awareness, relationship building and positive decision making. She then showed us a series of videos including a mother of one of the students, who told a firsthand story of the benefits and development of her child since joining the "family" of Voice of Hope. Next there were videos from the students themselves and how they live their favorite virtue/character, all very affirming of their work. She invited us to go on our own mission trip; drive 15 minutes south to tour their site and participate. Their strategic plan includes a Vision of twenty additional sites over the next ten years.
