Christine Allison is a marketer. She first worked as D Magazine's promotion manager in 1976, after a foiled attempt to start a newspaper for the Park Cities. More on that in a minute. After six years, she left D to create a boutique advertising agency, which served national and local clients. She sold it when she decided to move to New York with Wick Allison, with whom she now has four (remarkable) daughters.

Christine is also a writer. She has written thirteen books. Her range is wide, from John Paul II: A Tribute in Words and Pictures to 365 Bedtime Stories, 365 Days of Gardening, and Tell Me a Story, I'll Sing You a Song. In addition, she was a contributor to Reader's Digest for ten years.

The Allisons moved back to Dallas in 1995 to assume ownership of *D Magazine*, which in a few years, decided to acquire *Park* Cities People. Full circle, if you will. In 2000, she created D Home, and shepherded the creation of D Weddings and D's awardwinning website, Dmagazine.com.

She now has assumed the mantle of Editor-in-Chief and CEO of D Magazine Partners, and is responsible for all editorial and operations, as well as D Custom, a nationally-recognized content marketing agency. John Brown led the Pledge of Allegiance and "The Star Spangled Banner." Our visitors and quests were introduced. Happy Franklin introduced our Marketplace Advertiser of the week, Philip Ray, who is a criminal attorney.

Sgt-at-arms Cindy Cummings updated us on the RCPC Foundation. PE Barb explained how the RCPC Foundation is used. (See pg. 3 for more details.) The proceeds from the 4th of July Parade have been donated to the North Texas Food Bank.

Michael Rainwater reminded us to volunteer at Dentistry with a Heart at Agape Clinic. He said that they had received a grant from the RCPC for \$2,200 for the day, but that for each of those dollars, twelve dollars of dental work would be provided to low income clients. who could not afford the work otherwise.

PE Barb announce the slate of officers for the 2020-2021 Rotary Year. She also said that the club would be looking at ways the club could help Walnut Hill Elem. School, which was destroyed by the tornado. The University Park Tree Lighting will be the afternoon of Sunday, November 17; volunteers are needed. Marcia Zidle reviewed the requirements of new members before they receive their Blue Badges. Then she introduced our new members speaking today. First was Rob Levy who said he is a second generation Dallas native and a third generation healthcare provider. He was a

dentist and also taught in the hygiene program at Tarrant County Junior College. He volunteered at the free Dallas. ISD clinics, and became chair of the dental clinic until it was closed in 2008

due to lack of funds. He enjoys community service and delivers Meals on Wheels and tutors through Readers 2 Leaders. The motto Service Above Self prompted him to join.

Next to speak was **Jeff Brady**. who started by relating a story of being threatened at gunpoint while covering a story in Mexico. He also said

he ran into O.J. Simpson while covering the Super Bowl, and that he had seen an impressive launch of a space shuttle. He said he started this way because people always want to know some of the most interesting things he has experienced. He said he was born and grew up in Georgetown, and his dad was the first president of the RC of Georgetown. He has worked in TV in Louisiana and Arkansas before coming to WFAA. In 2009 he stared a media marketing and PR firm, sold it to his partner and is now teaching at UNT.


