Christina Murzin A family's mission to bridge the gap between tech and law enforcement

Christina Murzin is a native of Dallas and a graduate of the University of Texas at Austin where she earned a BBA. She married Chris Murzin in 1993 and worked in the pharmaceutical sales industry before deciding to stay home to raise their three children, Jack, Caroline and Dutch.

Christina volunteered extensively in her children's schools and served in leadership roles, including as Accessibility and Inclusion Chair and Co-President for SEPAC and as Treasurer and President for Connecting Point of Park Cities.

Tragically, Chris lost his life in a road rage incident in 2021, and the perpetrator responsible for his death remains at large, prompting Christina's determination to seek justice for her husband and others affected by similar tragedies. Through this determinization, The Chris Murzin Foundation, also known as Collaborative Homicide Research and Investigative Solutions or C.H.R.I.S., was formed. C.H.R.I.S., a 501(c)(3) organization, is dedicated to supporting law enforcement in solving unsolved homicide cases, providing hope and advocacy for victims and their families, and protecting communities affected by such crimes. By partnering with the private sector, C.H.R.I.S. aims to leverage innovative techniques and technology to enhance law enforcement efforts and bring closure to families who have lost loved ones to unsolved murders.

C.H.R.I.S. (Collaborative Homicide Research and Investigative Solutions) 501(c)(3) is a remarkable initiative born from a tragic event. It is an organization dedicated to supporting law enforcement in solving unsolved homicide cases, providing hope and advocacy for victims and their families, and protecting communities affected by such crimes. By partnering with the private sector, C.H.R.I.S. aims to leverage innovative techniques and technology to enhance law enforcement efforts and bring closure to families who have lost loved ones to unsolved murders.

On February 11, 2021, Chris Murzin was killed in a senseless act of violence, leaving his wife, Christina, their children, and family without answers. Chris' zest for life and love of family, community, work, and God did not come to an end with his untimely death. Rather than succumbing to grief and despair, Christina chose to take action, seeking justice for her husband and others who face similar circumstances. Her determination led her to put up billboards, hand out fliers, increase the reward through crime stoppers hire private investigators, and seek legal assistance.

While they haven't yet captured Chris's killer, these efforts have not been in vain. They have shed light on the challenges faced by families of homicide victims and the need for additional support and resources in solving unsolved cases. The experience gained from their own investigation has fueled the establishment of C.H.R.I.S., which goes beyond seeking justice for Chris. Every unsolved homicide represents a shattered life, a grieving family, and a community left in fear and uncertainty.



PE Sarah Oliai introduced our speakers today, the Presidents of the PTAs of the five HPISD elementary schools. They were asked how old their schools were and how many students attended. Boone is only five years old and has had a PTO for five years; they have 464 students. Hyer has had a PTA for 75 years and have 480 students. UP has had a PTA for 96 years and have 462 students. Bradfield has had a PTA for 99 years, and has 560 students They were asked the purpose of the PTAs. It is to build community ans relationships between families and school staff and also to raise money for events and to give back to the school. They were asked about the 70% of school tax dollars that go back to the state which results in a \$7 to 8 million shortfall every year. The goal is to raise at least \$600,000, but usually raise more. The money goes to support teachers' salaries, to fund technology and to fund the school cafeteria. There are four employed staff in the cafeterias, but all of the servers and cashiers are parent volunteers. They were asked what they had learned that they hadn't known. One was the amount of work that went on behind the scenes. About 60% of the funds raised comes from events. and 40% comes from donations from families and corporations






