President **Paul Pirok** called the meeting to order. **Nolan Duck** gave the invocation, noting that **Janie Loveless** was being released from the hospital today after back surgery. **George Burrell** led the Pledge of Allegiance and "The Star Spangled Banner." Among our visitors and guests today were Owen Devlin, the District Foundation Chair, and Past Presidents of the Dallas and the Preston Center Rotary Clubs. **Eric Heitkamp** introduced our Marketplace Advertiser of the Week, **Philip Ray**, a criminal defense attorney. **Daniel Drabinski** reported on the RCPC Foundation, and recognized **Alan Winn** and **Karl von Bieberstein** as the Foundation Funders this week. He also asked what Big Brothers Big Sisters Lone Star, Cristo Rey, the NTX Food Bank, and Agape Clinic had in common – which was that they had received money from the RCPC Foundation. President **Paul** announced a fundraiser on Nov. 5 with a veteran of Iwo Jima benefiting Roll Call which feeds veterans. District Foundation Chair, Owen Devlin, congratulated President **Paul** on being awarded a District grant for almost \$2,976 to support the scholarship fund. John Haley of the Uptown RC announced their annual fundraiser, Men Who Cook, with food prepared by celebrity chefs and a silent auction. This year it will be held at Lawley Art Group on Dragon St; tickets are \$35 per person.

Happy Franklin introduced today's speaker, Eve Hill-Agnus, the Dining Critic for *D Magazine*. She started by saying, how do you become a food critic? There is no major in it, but the skills are cobbled together. She explained that she grew up in France and that her stepmo-

ther is Japanese, and all of this has influenced her palate. She said when she moved to Dallas, it was a completely different experience. She started teaching, but was freelancing at the same time. Her first article was about a goat cheese maker in Flower Mound. She said she enjoys being a "fly on the wall" and watching people do what they love to do, and food being made. She said she was shocked when she was asked to be a food critic and realized that she was going to have to express her own opinions. She said she felt nervous about her new role and inadequate in writing about restaurants where she couldn't afford to eat. When she visits, she makes a reservation in a name that is not her own and takes another person or a group of friends with her. She visits each restaurant three times on different days of the week. She said she is often too busy thinking about the food to eat much. She can't take notes, so she must remember the temperatures of the food, the taste, the smell, how it looks and how people interact with the food. She tries to take pictures, but she usually writes her review up soon after she gets home. It is a demanding job in the sense that her social life and job are intertwined. It is a fascinating job and a fascinating way to get to know the city; it is also a very public job. When she did the steak issue, they hadn't been reviewed in a decade. She ate at steak houses six days a week for five weeks. She noticed that the waiters spoke to the men, and even asked a man what she was eating. So she wrote "The Misogyny of Steakhouses" and had never received so much feedback. There were a lot of different responses, but she enjoyed the discussion. She said that particularly in Dallas, new young chefs are making restaurants an experience. Dallas is one of the top cities for spending money on food.
