Marc Liebman, Citizen Sailor, Businessman and Author US-China Relations

Marc is a combat veteran of Vietnam, the Tanker Wars of the 1980s and Desert Shield/Storm and retired from the Navy as a Captain after 26 years of service. He is a Naval Aviator with just under 6,000 hours of flight time in helicopters and fixed wing aircraft. Captain Liebman has worked with the armed forces of Australia, Canada, Japan, Thailand, Republic of Korea, the Philippines and the U.K.

He has been the CEO of a \$50M aerospace and defense contractor and a partner in two different consulting firms advising clients on business and operational strategy and sales and marketing. He speaks on American history, from the American Revolu-tion to the War of 1812, as well as selected topics on aviation, foreign affairs, getting published and leadership.

His latest career is as an award-winning novelist. Five of his 13 novels have become Amazon #1 Best Sellers as well as winning other nationally recognized awards. The Liebmans live near Aubrey, Texas. Marc is married to Betty, his lovely wife of 53+ years.

what bike trails need to be extended. It is important to get to know your Commissioners, as well as your County Judge. We all five vote as a body. That is the Commissioners Court. We set the budget and spends the money on the residents' behalf here in Dallas County. Commissioner Andy Sommerman has been a great help in handling difficult problems. There have been some terrible problems in the Juvenile Department and we are trying to get that fixed. It is important to understand whether a kid is in trouble or whether a kis is an A student. These kids are the future of our community, and we don't want to train any child to be a career criminal or become a dangerous person. If a kid gets in trouble, our goal is to get them, recovering, back to their mom and dad or whoever they live with. We are trying to keep what was happening from happening. It seems to be going pretty well. The next thing he wanted to talk about was personal safety, Right now, there is very low COVID, very low flu and almost non-existant RSV. The doctors remind him that it is very important for people over sixty get their RSV shot because they think there will be more RSV than we have had in the past. RSV used to affect only young children, but now there is a strain of the virus that will affect people sixty and older. If somebody is in a mental health crisis and threatening suicide. the phone number to call is 988, the national mental health number. It is not normal for anyone to say they don't need to be alive. If people are anxious or depressed, it doesn't hurt them to ask questions; it is worse to ignore them because they want somebody to care. Also, if you go to houses of worship, be aware. There is not a credible threat of violence. but there is internet chatter about wanting to harass or harm houses of worship, especially synagogues. Hamas has called for Days of Rage, and we may see more evidence of this in America.




