John Brown introduced our speaker today, Norman Alston, who is the current President of Preservation Dallas.He began by saying that he was always glad to speak about Fair Park He said that he was part

of the team that argued for and finally got the management contract for Fair Park. He said that he is at Fair Park about half a day. He is doing mostly planning at this time. The amount of deferred main-tenance is about \$400 Million. Deferred maintenance will get the air conditioners working, the toilets flushing, flowers in the flower boxes and flags on the flag poles. Now if you go to Fair Park, it looks closed. A lot of the team members recognize that we have a very unique Park. However, there is a long history of neglect and a difficult history with the neighbors. Fair Park First has been tasked with fixing all of that. That is underway. He is particularly exci-ted about Proposition 8. It is a mechanism where hotel occupancy tax could be used to improve the community. It was used for the American Air Lines Center, which brought a lot of visitors to Dallas. This time Prop 8 will fund improvements to the Convention Center and to Fair Park, Fair park was built in 1936 to celebrate the Texas Centennial. It is the nation's only intact, unaltered pre-1950s world fair site. It is a national historic landmark and is unique in its architecture. There is no real vision for where Fair park is supposed to be today. The first thing they are working on is a community park that will always be open. Much of that is being funded by philanthropy. They are trying to get some more major events. One is the World Cup in four years. It is a seven-month commitment.. Many of the buildings do not have the amenities for a lot of people..


