Gene Pugh, US Marine Corps (Ret). Special Operations in Vietnam

SSGT Pugh was a member of one of the U.S. Army's most elite and secretive units during the war in Vietnam. SSGT Pugh enlisted in the U.S. Army at Fort Polk, Louisiana in 1966. He graduated from Airborne School and reported to Fort Bragg for Special Forces training as a radio operator. He cross-trained in intelligence and as an assistant medic.

SSGT Pugh was assigned to the 5th Special Forces Group in Vietnam. He was further assigned to the Military Assistance Command Vietnam Studies and Observation Group (MACVSOG). SOG consisted of personnel from U.S. Army Special Forces, SEALs, U.S. Air Force, U.S. Marine Corps Force Reconnaissance, and CIA personnel.

Special operations were conducted in North Vietnam, Laos, Cambodia, and South Vietnam. Missions evolved over time, and included strategic reconnaissance, direct action, sabotage, personnel recovery, PSYOPS, counter-intelligence, and bomb damage. These missions included monitoring enemy troops movements, locating fueling stations and command centers. and capturing enemy personnel. SSGT Pugh was assigned to a reconnaissance team consisting of three Americans and eight former No1ih Vietnamese (NVA) soldiers.

These American-led reconnaissance teams were a 'thorn in the side' of North Vietnamese operations along the Ho Chi Minh trail. These teams diverted 50,000 to 70,000 NV A troops who were assigned to capture the teams. These SOG Recon Teams had a 158 to 1 kill ratio against the NV A. The U.S. military kept tight security over knowledge of the recon teams' existence and operations for several decades.

Thirteen MACVSOG personnel earned the Medal of Honor. Another 22 members of the unit received the Distinguished Service Cross, our nation's second highest award for valor.

SSGT Pugh is a distinguished speaker and author. His published books include *Surrender Not An Option* and *The Reunion Mission.*

> Jack Carpenter introduced our speaker today, Mark Liebman, to speak on U.S. China Relations. He began

by saying that the leaders of the People's Republic of Ciina view foreign policy like a giant game of Go, A Chinese board game of strategy. The idea is to place stones on the board to surround your adversary without having to fight them. He said he puts the threat to the U.S. and the world has four dimensions. The Peoples' Republic and the Chinese Communists have drawn a line in the South China Sea, saying that all this is our turf. The fact that the Vietnames, the Indonesians, the Filipinos, the Malavsians and the Singaporeans all have claime to that land does not bother them a bit. it is I"lawfare," or I am going to claim this and you have to prove them wrong. Meanwhile, the South China Sea is an area of constant concern. Dimension number one is disrupting our economy.which started thirty years ago. In the last thirty years they have stolen our intellectual property. They have domne this through theft and also by requiring companies who want to do business in China must share their intellectual property. They also send their students to our top engineering and science schools who then take that knowledge back to China. They also set up front organizations to influence leaders and communities. Dimension 2 is attacking our culture and our political system, by influencing elections and by contributing to politicians and providing the media talking points. The People's Republic has the largest military, while we have been drawing down our military. If you look at Chinese planes and ships, they look a lot like ours did ten years ago. They also lend money to small countries, and then ask for favors.


