Prof Dr Simon Mak is the Linda A. and Kenneth R. Morris Endowed Executive Director of the Caruth Institute for Entrepreneurship and Prof of Practice in the Dept of Strategy, Entrepreneurship, and Business Economics at the SMU Cox School of Business.

Mary Bishop introduced our Marketplace Advertiser of the week, Kyle Marmillion, an Insurance Advisor with McGriff.

President Jeff read the slate of nominees for Officers and Board Members for the 2024-25 Rotary Year. He asked for nominations from the floor. There were none.

Daniel Voight gave his new mem-ber speech, saying he was born in Indiana, and grew up in Arizona. He attended Baylor University and earned a degree in economics. He works for Co-


merica Bank. He and his wife have two sons. two and four years old. He agrees with the Rotary goal of service above self.

Cub Amos introduced our speaker today, Gene Pugh, who spoke on "Special Operations in Viet Nam. He said he was a paratrooper and a special forces soldier, and that being a special forces soldier is a state of mind. There have been special forces through history. In America the first special forces were the Green Mountain Boys. In the 1950s there was a cold war, and the military wanted a group of men for guerilla-type warfare. Viet Nam was a CIA war. The administration and the military did not trust the CIA because of the debacle of the Bay of Pigs. In 1968 he was one of a group of six men who were assigned to monitor a trail in Laos coming off of the Ho Chi Minh Trail. It was in the jungle where you could not see the sun. All of a sudde it gets very quiet; you wonder what caused it. Visibility in the jungle is only seven vards. Combat is at close guarters. They were in Laos getting information. They answered only to the White House and Central Command. They were commanded by the Army, a part of the Air Force and funded by the Navy in a deep budget. They operated in North and South Viet Nam, Laos and a contingency for Burma and southern China. They did not recognize conventional borders because they wanted to knowwhat was happening across the borders, but it wasn't acknowledged that they were there.


