Dr. Ronan Kelly, Chief of Oncology at BSWH Current Developments in Oncology at BSWH

Dr. Kelly received his medical degree from the Royal College of Surgeons in Ireland in 1998. He completed his internship, residency and oncology fellowship from the Royal College of Physicians in Ireland in 2007. Dr. Kelly completed a second fellowship in medical oncology at the National Cancer Institute (NCI) in Bethesda MD from 2007-2009 and continued as a clinical researcher in thoracic oncology at the NCI until moving to Johns Hopkins in 2011. At Johns Hopkins, Dr. Kelly was the director of the gastroesophageal cancer therapeutics program and also served as the director of global oncology for Johns Hopkins International. Dr. Kelly was recruited as the Director of Oncology for the Charles A. Sammons Cancer Center and the Chief of Oncology for the North Texas Division of the BSWH system in 2018.

Dr. Kelly performs translational and clinical research encompassing the discovery and the development of new targeted and immunotherapeutic approaches in the prevention and treatment of gastroesophageal cancer and lung cancer and he is the International principal investigator on a number of global phase II/III clinical trials in these disease areas. In addition he is leading efforts nationally and internationally to design quality metrics for solid tumors and implementing value-based algorithms to help bend the

cost curve in the United States. At the Charles A. Sammons Cancer Center he also helps to co-lead the Innovative Clinical Trials Center which investigates novel therapeutics across a range of tumor types. He serves as the co-chair of the International Association for the Study of Lung Cancer (IASLC) and the American Society of Clinical Oncology (ASCO) taskforce working to improve the quality of care received by lung cancer patients worldwide. He is an active member of ASCO and the Eastern Cooperative Oncology group. He is a founding member of the International Quality Oncology Taskforce in ASCO and serves on the ASCO measures taskforce, the clinical practice committee and the lung cancer quality taskforce. He has authored and co-authored over 150 peer-reviewed publications, abstracts and book chapters, and contributed his work to many prominent healthcare journals.

Dr. Kelly's leadership of oncology services spans Baylor Scott & White's footprint in the Dallas-Fort Worth area, which includes Baylor University Medical Center-the System's North Texas flagship hospital and one of the largest cancer hospitals in the nation-as well as a network of 11 Baylor Charles A. Sammons Cancer Centers throughout Texas.

the years. Over 300,000 children have been helped with the most complex orthopedic cases as well as certain related arthritic and neurological disorder and learning disorders. The specialist in their six Centers for Excellence spend a life time practicing, researching and pioneering pediatric orthopedic care: Scoliosis and Spine, Limb Lengthening, Hand Disorders, Clubfoot and Foot Disorders, Hip Disorders, and Sports Medicine.

Our speaker, **Stephanie Brigger** is VP of Development. She has been with the organization since 2003. She stressed that donors and volunteers are the core of success and relied on to help make Scottish Rite a positive experience for the children and their families. No one is charged for their services. In 2020, their budget will be \$184 million and this is all raised by private donations and with NO government money involved. A new facility has been open in Frisco with day and out patient care with the possibility of hospital beds later, if needed. Also the STAR Complex will have another Sports Medicine addition.



Another special guest was a former patient, **Desmond** was born without hands and shared his story. Crediting Scottish Rite, its staff, his mother and grandmother with always coming up with a creative solution as he grew and faced new challenges. He is an artist and learned to color. then draw and paint with two hands. Scottish Rite built him a special, portable drawing table to lock in his paper and the equipment needed to complete his projects in High School and then college where he added a IT degree to his Art degrees. He now works at Scottish Rite in their tech department. He loves watching the "magic" happen for kids as it did for him at Scottish Rite.
