Nate Weymouth introduced our speaker today, John Ragosta, a historian and author. His most recent



book, For the People, For the Country, about Patrick Henry, Nate's great-grandfather. John Ragosta began by saying that he thinks the story about Pstrick Henry is one that more people need to know about. It is a story of hyper-partisanship in 6h3 1790s that almost destroyed the nation. The story starts at Mt. Vernon. George Washington was in retirement. On January 15, 1799, Washington wrote to Patrick Henry. Although they had not communicated for many years, he wrote that there was a crisis and that some people were puting their personal ambitions above the country. He wrote that measures were being pursued that ultimately would dissolve the union, that there was threat of civil war. Washington asked Patrick Henry to come out of retirement and run for office. He had also been retired for many years, and had told Washington he would only come out of retirement if the country faced anarchy. It was Thomas Jeffer-son and James Madison who were being viewed as a threat due to their states' rights agenda. Patrick Henry comes out of retire-ment, runs for office and wins his election, but dies before he can take office. Had Patrick Henry lived, Thomas Jefferson almost certianly would not have become president. Why was Patrick Henry, the intellectual godfather of states' rights, opposing states' rights? If Jefferson would not have been elected president, does this tell us something important about Jefferson? Why is this story not a bigger part of history? These questions are what started his research. It starts in 1789 when the country starts under the Constitution and Washington is elected President. The country is immediately in aforeign policy crisis because of the French Revolution. For almost twenty-five years, England and France would be at war. Both wanted the U.S. to be an ally. Washington realized that the country was too new to get involved and in 1793 issued a neutrality proclamation. (More of this story on RCPC



in larger communal spaces—a solution they first implemented during Hurricane Harvey in 2017. Families can also use these tents to create protected areas inside damaged homes while making crucial repairs.

These aren't just supplies; they are vital sources of security in a time of chaos, helping families feel seen, supported, and cared for.

Late in October Rotarians met in Greensboro. NC to help pack kits to prepare emergency aid items for immediate distribution.

To further support long-term recovery efforts, ShelterBox committed a \$100,000 matching gift grant to the Rotary Zone 33/34 Disaster Relief Fund, amplifying every dollar.
