Mary Brinegar, President and CEO Dallas Arboretum and Botanical Garden

Mary Brinegar is President and CEO of the Dallas Arboretum, a Dallas Park that is an economic engine for the Dallas Metroplex with a 24.1 million dollar budget. She joined the Dallas Arboretum in 1996 as President and CEO. A graduate of Southern Methodist University, she was previously employed at KERA/Channel 13 and The Dallas Opera for nine years each.

At the Arboretum she is responsible for the management of a full time staff of 170, and for the annual operating budget of \$24.1 million. She has won many awards for her fundraising leadership and accomplishments while at the garden. Since she joined the botanic garden, the board and staff have raised over \$100 million dollars for capital improvements including new buildings, gardens and the renovation of the historic homes. The Arboretum currently has 40,000 members and attendance is expected to attract over a million guests in 2018.

Her achievements include:

- 1) The 1984 Fund Raising Executive of the Year Award from the Dallas Chapter of the Association of Fundraising Professionals
- 2) The 1981 Extra Mile Award recognizing community service by one professional woman each year sponsored by the Business and Professional Women's Club of Dallas
 - 3) Sustainer of the Year in 2000 by the Junior League of Dallas

- 4) In 2004 she received the Dallas Historical Society's Arts Leadership Award
- 5) She was named by the YWCA as one of their 100 Women in 100 Years in 2009
- 6) In 2010 she was named one of the Women in Business Industry Leaders by The Dallas Business Journal
- 7) In 2011 she was awarded honorary membership into the Dallas Chapter of the American Institute of Architects
- 8) In September of 2013 she was named the 2014 Virginia Chandler Dykes Award winner for community service by Texas Women's University and was be honored at a luncheon celebrating this in February 2014
- 9) In November of 2014 she was named one of the recipients of the 2014 SMU Distinguished Alumni Award
- 10) In June of 2015 she was designated as a Dallas Historical Society Honorary Trustee
- 11) She chaired or has been president of numerous organization and chair of many community fundraising events as a volunteer
- 12) She has been a member of Leadership Dallas, Leadership Texas and Leadership America
- 13) She served on the national board for the American Association of Botanical Gardens and Arboreta

labs for children in the third grade in every school in Dumaguete City. He began the project when he was in the Peace Corps assigned to The Philippines. At first, they collected used computers and refurbished them. That also required that the schools be rewired, which was expensive. Then a typhoon came through and destroyed what they had started. So, the plan was changed to provide tablets to the children, which had the advantages of being less expensive and more portable. They did not get permission from the Department of Education in Dumaguete City, so they implemented the plan in the suburbs. It was so successful that the Mayor of Dumaguete City contributed \$42,000 for the project, which, in addition to the grants from RCPC and Rotary International, raised their total from\$107,000. They are planning to provide all 13,500 students with tablets, which will give them the skills they need to succeed in high school.

Marcia Zidle introduced our new members who were speaking today. First, was
