Brad Alberts, President and Chief Executive Officer

Brad Alberts is in his second tenure with the Dallas Stars and currently serves as President and Chief Executive Officer after rejoining the team in February 2011. Named team President on March 2, 2018, Alberts oversees all aspects of the Stars business operations. Previously leading all sales and marketing, he is also in charge of all aspects of the organi-zation's finance

and ad-ministration, box office, human resources and information technology Additionally, Alberts serves on the American Airlines Center Board of Directors, assisting in the management of one of the busiest arenas in the United States. Alberts also continues to act as president and alternate governor of the Texas Stars, Dallas' top development affiliate in the American Hockey League, roles which he has served in since July 1, 2017.

Alberts' career includes nearly two decades of professional sports experience selling tickets, suites, premium seating, and sponsorships. From 1996-2009, Alberts worked for the Dallas Stars and Texas Rangers in various sales management roles in tickets, suites and corporate sponsorships. From 2006-09, Alberts served as the Executive Vice President of the Hicks Sports Marketing Group, the in-house sponsorship sales group for the Stars, Texas Rangers, and Liverpool Football Club. In 2009, Alberts took over as the Vice President of Sponsorship and Sales at Legends/CSL, overseeing a number of events at numerous venues around the country, most notably the Circuit of The Americas, a Formula One racing track in Austin. Texas.

Since rejoining the team in 2011, Alberts has played an integral role in the resurgence of the Stars in the Dallas-Fort Worth Metroplex, helping lead the organization to tremendous growth in brand visibility, attendance and sponsorship sales. Alberts and his leadership team were instrumental in the sweeping rebrand of the team, retiring the numbers of Mike Modano and Jere Lehtinen and creating tremendous sponsorship value for the team and its partners.

Alberts received his bachelor's degree from Ripon College in 1992 where he was a four-year lettermen and co-captain of the basketball team, earning an induction into the Ripon College Athletic Hall of Fame in 2002. He received a master's degree in sports administration from Northern Colorado in 1995. Alberts is an avid golfer, and fitness enthusiast.

He resides with his wife and their daughter, Grace, in Dallas, Texas.

Ed Fjordbak introduced our speaker today, Jody Grant, Founding Chair and CEO of Texas Capital Bank, who

spoke on Klyde Warren Bank. He began by showing a picture of the area before the park. The Park opened in 2012, but there are new plans to expand and transform it.

It is unususal because it is managed, has a budget and staff. They do not get any money from the state. It earns its own money. It has become the town square of Dallas. There are a variety of activities going on most of the time. People are having fun there. They have a \$125 million improvement plan. They are relocating and enlarging the dog park and are enlarging the children's park. They will be expanding the Park by two blocks down the freeway which will add another 1.7 acres. They will be building a very unique fountain; it will have three "trees" which are twelve feet tall and which will surround the powerful water jets so no one can get near them and get hurt. They will also have "dancer" fountains which will be lit at night. All of the fountains will allow proplr to interact with them. The new part of the children's park will be for children five to ten or twelve years old. It will have things that kids like to do, but will also improve them physically. They are adding a shade area. A generous donor gave them five million dollars for the children's park. He said he is having fun planning and working on the Park. They will be building an event Pavillion on the new portion of the Park where activities can take place on rainy days. On the ground floor will be a visitor center for Dallas. It will be all digital. There will be a roof garden on the top which will have great views of Dallas. There will be a lobby where public trans-portation can drop people off. Near the Pavillion is Jacob Lawn which was donated by Jacob Engineering. This will be an area for large events and will be an ice skating rink in the winter. The Park sees about a million visitors every year.

Rotary International Pledges \$97 Million for Sustainable Projects in 2022.

Rotary International President-elect Jennifer Jones took the stage at the Global Citizen Live concert on 25 September in Paris. France, and pledged \$97 million in grant funding from the organization next year for sustainable, Rotary club-led projects.

"Every day millions of girls walk miles to fetch clean water, and millions of boys are on the streets instead of going to school. Every day moms and dads struggle to find ways to feed their children," Jones said from the main stage in Paris. "And every day, members of Rotary and Global Citizen start our days knowing that we can make a difference."
