


District 5810 Wins Awards at Zone

Patsy Watson introduced our speaker today, Rebecca Jowers, founder and executive director of the Poiema Foundation. She spoke on human trafficking. She began by saving that her husband has been a Rotarian for over • Empower- survivor aftercare, safe house twenty years. She said that she would give an overview of the problem of human trafficking. She said when she first started her work, it was difficult to get a conviction. The police were not well-informed. It was easier to get a conviction on a parole violation or a gun or drug charge to get the trafficker off the street. The Trafficking Victims Protection Act was

passed in 2000. Since then there has been more success in getting convic tions for trafficking. The CDC defines "trafficking" as "a modern form of slavery. It involves controlling a person through force, fraud or coercion to expoit the victim for forced labor, sexual exploitation or both. Calls from the trafficking hotline have come from every state. It is a hidden industry and it is difficult to get accurate numbers on trafficking. A recent study done at the UT-Austin School of Social Work found that there were 313,000 victims of trafficking just in Texas last year. Seventy-nine thousand minors and youth were victims of sex trafficking in Texas last year, and 234,000 workers were victims of labor trafficking. Minor and youth sex trafficking costs the state of Texas approximately \$6.6 billion. She told the story of an eighteen year old girl who was vulnerable and who did not realize that she was being trafficked by her boyfriend. He had given her money and bought her expensive things, and she believed he loved her. It took her five years to realize she was being trafficficking is a problem globally. Refugees are vulnerable to being trafficked, and traffickers take advantage of their plight. During COVID-19, when kids were not in school, online recruitment increased twenty-two percent, recruitment through Facebook increased one hundred and twenty-five percent, and recruitment through Instagram increased ninety-five percent. Familial trafficking also increased fortyseven percent. She explained that her foundation, Poiema, id a faith-based organization. They have four main pillars of what they do:

- · Educate- prevention, victim identification
- Engage- community awareness, recovery]

- Eradicate- young men's discipleship program They have a curriculum for training health care personnel. They help victims leave the life. They have held an outreach at a truckstop. The only way to eradicate trafficking is to change the hearst of men. Missing kids are taken from place to place and truckers have a good chance of seeing them.






