ROTARY INTERNATIONAL

World Polio Day is October 24!

Rotary has been working to eradicate polio for more than 35 years. the goal of ridding the world of this disease is closer than ever.

As a founding partner of the Global Polio Eradication Initiative, RI has reduced polio cases by 99.9 percent since the first project to vaccinate children in the Philippines in 1979.

Rotary members have contributed more than \$2.1 billion and countless volunteer hours to protect nearly 3 billion children in 122 countries from this paralyzing disease. Rotary's advocacy efforts have played a role in decisions by governments to contribute more than \$10 billion to the effort.

Today, polio remains endemic only in Afghanistan and Pakistan, but it's crucial to continue working to keep other countries polio-free. If all eradication efforts stopped today, within 10 years, polio could paralyze as many as 200,000 children each year.

In 1988, the Global Polio Eradication Initiative (GPEI) was launched by collaborations between Rotary International *(continued on page 3)*

He began his talk by saying that Marty Turco was not able to come today because he was out fundraising. He said it had been an interesting two years. The Stars made it to the finals for the Stanley Cup. He said January 1, 2019, was

the greatest day in Stars history. They sold out the Cotton Bowl, 85,000 people. It turned out to be a great celebration of sports. He had proposed the game to the NHL, but had taken the Commissioner to the Cotton Bowl on a very hot summer day. He had to sell the Commissioner on the game. He was very pleased when the tickets sold out in three days. He had to add seats. Dallas likes big events! The year started off incredibly well, but then everything was shut down. Nothing prepared them for what they had to face in the last two years. He hopes the worst is over. What has been proposed for this year is that they will play a full season of eighty-two games, with days off and time for practice. He said the team has a good mix of young players; if they are committed to playing well, they will do well. They also have a good mix of veteran NFL players who deserve to win a Stanley Cup. The Captain is a special guy, and there is nobody he would rather see win. He is really about the players they have on the team. He appreciates the fans' support. The Stars are the only hockey team in Texas. Every time something bad happens to the Arizona hockey team, there is talk of moving it to Houston. The growth of hockey in Dallas over the last twenty years is remarkable. There is a grassroots hockey team in Austin. He is working on turning Dallas into a hockey city. They have hosted the World Junior Championships in Frisco. It was being planned for Michigan, but they couldn't play there because of the lockdown, so they took the opportunity and pulled together what was needed for the event in thirty days. It gave the hockey community the chance to see what a great city Dallas was for hockey. He is trying to bring more big events; they are good for the game and for the city. He was asked who would be the starters this year. He said that it might take a few games to figure it out. He was asked about the Stars Foundation; it supports games for kids and provides all of the equipment so kids can try the sport.

and the World Health Organization.

1988-There are an estimated 350,000 cases of polio in 125 countries.

1994-The International Commission for the Certification of Poliomyelitis Eradication announces that polio has been eliminated from the Americas

1995- Health workers and volunteers immunize 165 million children in China and India in 1 week.

2000- A record 550 million children – almost 10% of the world's population – receive the oral polio vaccine. The Western Pacific region, spanning from Australia to China, is declared polio-free.

2003- The Rotary Foundation raises \$119 million in a 12-month campaign. Rotary's total contribution to polio eradication exceeds \$500 million. Six countries remain polio-en-
